Hi Everyone:

A blessed a joyous New Year to all of you in the Christ Church family. We are beginning a New Year and the continuation of a great adventure together. Over 50 of you covenanted with me on Sunday to participate in the "Read through the New Testament in 2012". **Note:** if you were not in worship Sunday I asked people to make a covenant with me to read the New Testament according to the plan I have outlined and to join, at some level, in the discussion. If you would like to join the covenant – reply to this email saying you will join us. I have asked all those in the covenant to pray for me and I will be praying for all of you. We "cleared the decks" and prepared our hearts to be better followers of Christ in 2012. I am enjoying the fact that winter has apparently finally arrived (with some decent cold and snow).

Here is what is going on at Church:

1. We were 110 in worship Sunday (not bad for New Year's morning). It was good to have the 9:00 worship team back to work. Thank you to all who assisted in worship – especially my communion setters and servers. We are profoundly blessed to have so many willing to make a difference in big and small ways. I never remember to say "thank you" to our "Tech" guys – especially Tom Weaver and Scott Smith – they do a great job with the sound and running the power point. SO: Thank You Tech guys! Thank you also to Valarie and Keith Suffoletto who put the power point presentations together for us on a week to week basis; they have been GREAT!

2. This Sunday, January 8, I will be preaching from one of the first five chapters of Mark (from the readings we have in this first week of through the New Testament). I really liked this morning's reading of the four friends lowering their friend through the roof into the presence of Jesus – but I am waiting for the Holy Spirit to give me a nudge.

3. **Through the New Testament in 2012:** we are reading 1 chapter a day from the New Testament on week days. We began with the Gospel according to St. Mark on Monday, January 2. The schedule for this

I am excited about 2012. It is my prayer that we will journey deeper in our faith in Jesus Christ. I believe the primary way this happens is through direct contact – we go deeper through prayer, through our encounter with God's word (aka the Bible), and in the intentional living of life together in the Christian community. How will I know we are going deeper? Three things: 1) joy is increased – our life in Christ will be reflected in our approach and attitude to life; 2) our witness will increase – many times in the New Testament the one thing that draws people to the church community is "that these people have been with Jesus" we will know we are going deeper because people will want to join us; 3) our mission and ministry will increase. I am absolutely convinced that the deeper our personal relationship with God the deeper our commitment to building God's kingdom on earth. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, frequently taught that personal holiness had to be lived out as social holiness. That is the closer I am to Christ the more I want to make a difference for him in this world.

I am excited about two new class opportunities. I am not sure how these groups will evolve, but I am praying that God will draw to Wednesday Morning and Sunday evening men and women (and youth and, yes, even children) who want to grow deeper in their knowledge and relationship with Jesus Christ and with each other. I am excited that we have multiple opportunities for our community: there is the Thursday class with Diane Klenk, there is the AOL class on Sunday morning, there is a gathering at the Gavin's home every other Sunday evening. These growth opportunities should drive us to greater mission and ministry in Amherst, Buffalo, New York, the USA and to the ends of the earth.
