Hi Everyone:

I am deeply blessed by the generosity of the Christ Church family. You have demonstrated this generosity in many ways but I have seen it in special and significant ways these past two weeks. First, hosting the Hope for Africa Children's Choir – many of you opened your homes, many of you helped with the meals at church, with transportation and Christ Church collected the largest offering this choir received on its two week journey to New York State: We received an offering of \$1573 for the HUMBLE school last Wednesday evening. THANK YOU. Special appreciation to Rev. Jim Pollard who helped me drive the Choir from Syracuse and back again; to Julie Wrisley who coordinated the housing; to Sally Pollard who coordinated the meals at the church; to Peggy Bermudez who provided lunch at Niagara Falls; to our friends at St. James UMC who hosted the concert last Tuesday evening and to the over 100 of you who came out to support the kids and attend the concert. It was a great event all around!

Secondly, we have been receiving pledges to replace the boilers. As of Sunday we have collected \$29,670 in new pledges for the boilers – this combined with the \$10,000 pledge we had already received puts us only \$330 from matching the \$40,000 matching gift. Just another \$330 and we can order the first of the new boilers and have all of the boilers replaced in the next 18 months. You have responded well and faithfully and, on behalf of the Trustees, again, THANK YOU. Any money that comes in over and above what we need will be used to make our building more energy efficient (there is some insulation that needs to be taken care of, a door that needs replacing, etc.). This will make our facilities more energy efficient, greener, and will save us some costs into the future.

Generosity comes in many forms. We have been generous with our homes, our time, and our resources. I have seen a generosity of spirit and "heart" that is profoundly encouraging as well.
