Hi Everyone:

We are now in the season of Advent and preparing to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Unlike Lent, which is a season of penance and sacrifice, Advent is a season of joyful anticipation. It is not a time of doom and gloom but a time to rejoice in the coming of Emmanuel. This is a time to remember, re-experience and relive the profound joy of the coming of the Savior, Jesus, into our lives. Advent is a time to consider the profound truth that is at the heart of Christmas – the mystery and wonder of the Incarnation. I saw a poster when I was a teen that said "for God so loved the world he did not send a sub-committee". When creation was in peril and in need of redemption, God chose to come, be born human and live among us. It is the great mystery and the essential truth of the Christian faith. God became a human being and lived among us. I challenge all of us to make some space this week to ponder the incarnation. One of my mentors once said "All Christian mission, preaching and activity is Incarnational". The Church is collectively called "the Body of Christ." God is incarnate in each of us but was uniquely incarnate in the person of Jesus of Nazareth.

Here is what is happening at Church:

1. Attendance last Sunday was 164. It was great to see many of our college age members back for the Thanksgiving weekend (pray for them as most of them head back to the end of a Semester and Final Exams). We launched the season of advent and lit the first Advent candle. Special appreciation to the praise team at 9:00 and the Choir at 11:00 and to all who participated.

2. Last night we held our Annual Church Conference. Rev. K. Wayne Butler, Niagara Frontier District Superintendent was present and presiding. There were several orders of business. We heard from our Lay Leaders (Peggy Bermudez and Dick Mugel). We approved the Pastoral Support package for 2012. We elected Trustees, SPRC members and other church leaders. We received a bequest from the estate of Mary Louise Coffin (Lou) for \$102,721 for the Christ UMC Endowment Fund. We heard concerns and news from the Annual Conference. It was announced that Ed Fisher has stepped down as the chair of the Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee (but will remain on the team) and that Roger Johnson will assume the role of chair beginning January 1, 2012. There were 23 present for this gathering.

3. This Sunday is the Second Sunday in Advent. The message is titled "You'd Better Not Pout" and will be taken from Isaiah 40 and Mark 1:1-8. This is also a Communion Sunday.

I am also planning to preach from the readings. My hope is that this will help us journey together as Christ followers.

We are still receiving pledges as there were other projects on the 60th anniversary drive we would like to have done. For example we would like to paint Crafts Hall and the Café'. There are also some other tightening projects (windows, doors) that will help our facility become more efficient. Thank you, Christ Church, for your great response.

I will be returning to Uganda in October 2012. Feel the call of God leading you in this direction? See me

I have been writing a book for the Nexus Seminary graduates. One of the frustrations of working in Uganda is the lack of Bible study materials in the native languages. The predominant language in Uganda is Lugandan. However, most Ugandans have some of three languages: English, Lugandan and their tribal language (there are many dozens of these). There is a Bible translation in Lugandan but it is not very good and was a translation of the King James Bible into Lugandan back in the 1890's. The Uganda Bible Society is working on a new Lugandan translation (from the original Hebrew and Greek) but this project is moving very slowly. Because of this lack my friends at Nexus Seminary are beginning to develop their own materials. All of our course materials are available in English and Lugandan. Rev. Davis Matovu has written some excellent Bible study material that will be available in English and Lugandan and I am writing a Bible Handbook/Theological Sampler that will be printed in English and Lugandan in parallel. A Bible handbook looks at all 66 books of the Bible and attempts to answer some basic background questions: who wrote it, when was it written, what other circumstances may be relevant to its writing, an outline of the book and a brief statement on a key learning from the book. The Theological Sampler is a small dictionary (400+ words) of commonly used words and phrases in Bible and theological study. Our goal is to provide better biblical resources for the rural pastor in Uganda to help them become more effective pastors and leaders and thereby build up the Christian church in Uganda. It is my hope that this book will be translated and published before my return to Uganda in October 2012.

I am praying that all of us are finding ways to "slow" down the season and pause and reflect on God's amazing gift
