We are finally at the bottom of the year. The Winter solstice – the longest night the shortest day in our hemisphere – is upon us this week. 5. I will be preaching from the readings of the week previous to each Sunday as we start the year.

Schedule: We begin with the Gospel according to Mark. January 2 – Mark 1; January 3 – Mark 2; January 4 – Mark 3; January 5 – Mark 4; January 6: Mark 5. I will post a brief introduction to Mark later next week on the <u>www.drbjthoughts.blogspot.com</u> to get us started.

This is a different way to do bible study – some on line, some face to face, all of us reading together. It should be fun and I believe will deepen our understanding of the New Testament and our Christian Story. In case you are wondering I arranged our readings so that key liturgical readings (Easter/Pentecost/Christmas) will be in our readings in timely ways.

Christmas is often depicted as a "Season of Giving". I have long suspected that this is a not so subtle commercialization encouraging us to get out there and buy stuff so that we can participate in the "Season of Giving". I have come to believe over the past several years two essential biblical truths of the celebration of Christmas:

1. It is a Season of Receiving. The gift of Christmas is not to be found wrapped in pretty paper under a tree in your living room. The gift of Christmas will be found wrapped in swaddling clothes laying in a manger. This is the celebration of God's gift to humanity. It is a celebration of God's amazing love – a love so great that God would enter God's own creation to redeem us. We cannot give this gift, we cannot earn this gift, it cannot be wrapped, it cannot be purchased – it can only be received. As the Christmas Carol so succinctly put it:

"How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is given;

So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of his heaven.

Nor ear may hear his coming, but in this world of sin,

Where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in."

Make space this Christmas to welcome the Lord Jesus into your heart, once again.

2. It IS a season for Giving: but as Christians we have to take this beyond the norm. It is not MY birthday. (Except for Tim Reed – it is not YOUR birthday either). It is a celebration of the Birth of Jesus Christ. Shouldn't he be given the gifts? And, if my reading of Matthew 25 is correct, shouldn't the gifts

be given to "the least of these my brothers and sisters?" To provide food for the hungry, water for the thirst, clothing for the naked, help for those wrongly imprisoned, hope for the hopeless, strength for the weakened. . . you get the idea.

In the Season of Christmas, first receive the gift of the Christ child! Then, find a way to make a difference in this world in his name and for his sake.

I am blessed to be your Pastor, and deeply blessed by all of the kind remembrances that have been sent my way. I have enjoyed the cards and cookies and invitations and other kind gifts. Thank you.
