Hi Everyone:

I am still coming down from a great Christmas weekend (celebration of the Feast of the Incarnation). I want to thank all of you who agreed to be readers on Christmas Eve and the brave souls that volunteered to help out with the "Instant Christmas" on Christmas morning. Thank you to my candle lighters and all the ushers. We were 247 evening and morning – a great showing. Thank you Elizabeth Holt Cutis for all the extra musical work that makes Christmas Eve/Day so very special. Thank you to Sally Pollard who pulled the items together for Instant Christmas and so much more to make our celebration and post celebration gatherings excellent. Thank you Rachel for the extra bulletins and to Dave who keeps the place nice and clean and looking great! Thank you Christ Church family for making me and my family feel so very welcome this Advent/Christmas. It was a bit strange being in a new town for the first time in nearly 30 years . . . you made me feel like I was a part of the family from the very beginning: thank you. And, finally, thank you for the Christmas gifts – the bonus from the church and all of the other little remembrances from cookies and cards to golf balls. I am deeply blessed.

Here is what is happening at Church:

1. Christmas Eve and Day – 170 at the 10:00; 12 at the 11:30; 75 on Christmas morning – that totals 247. Well done everyone. Next year we'll double it. (grin). If you ordered poinsettias you can now take them home.

Christmas is not a day it is a season on the church calendar. It is a season that stretches for 12 days (today being the 3^{rd} day of Christmas) to the 6^{th} of January which is called Epiphany. Happy Christmas season, everyone!

2. This Sunday is January 1, 2012. We are back to our regular worship schedule: 9:00 praise and 11:00 "traditional". I am going to be preaching from Philippians 3:12-16. St. Paul says: this I do, I forget what

lies behind and I press on toward the upward calling of God in Christ Jesus my Lord. January 1 is a great day to unpack our bags from the previous year and see what we would like to leave behind so that we can press on into the new year.

January 1 is one of those significant dates on the calendar. It is when the numbers change. We stop writing 2011 on our checks and start writing 2012. We switch our calendars over (throw out the old, bring in the new) and we "start a new year". It is customary in our country to make "New Year's Resolutions" – these are promises we make to ourselves to "drop a few pounds" to "get back to the gym" to "finish that class" or start something new. Resolutions are good as they can often serve as motivation for change. However, as we have all discovered over the years, resolutions don't really help if we don't have a plan for change. If you are going to drop a few pounds: how? What's the plan? Are you joining weight watchers or are you going to down load that new fitness app? Will you do it alone (that's the really hard way) or will you join a group, a process or a team? What's the plan? Is your resolution to "read the bible" or draw closer to God? What's the plan? Will you Join a class, or start the

New Testament reading? What will you do to keep the interest up? Will you join with others? Don't just make a resolution: have a plan and follow through. Make an accountability partner – give someone permission to ask how you are doing. Give someone permission to check on your progress toward whatever your goal. The keys to successful change: Have a vision (a picture of the preferred future). Set a goal. Have a plan. Have a way to evaluate the plan and modify the plan as necessary. Finally, don't wait for motivation, just do it and the motivation will follow.

I am looking forward to a great 2012 for the Christ Church community. There is terrific energy at the church. I believe a fresh wind of the Holy Spirit is blowing among and through us. I believe great times and greater ministry are in front of us. We have a vision: 100 in Sunday School 500 in worship by 2015. We have some intermediate goals.
