The events leading up to the season of lent always intrigue me. On the one side is the "Mardi Gras" aka "Fat Tuesday" event. Since Lent is a season of fasting and abstinence there is that human tendency to have "one last party, one last fling" before the season. Hence the New Orleans (and others) over indulgence and conspicuous consumption leading up to Ash Wednesday. There is another tradition that refers to the day before Ash Wednesday as "Shrove Tuesday". This tradition looks at the coming fast and abstinence season and steps back a day to prepare. The Shrove Tuesday tradition would feature a

meatless (often pancake) dinner before Ash Wednesday as a day to prepare for the coming fast. I find that kind of "event focus" somewhat wide of the mark. If we choose to enter a time of self denial as a means of focusing our spiritual lives and deepening our relationship with Jesus, just do it. All of the Last Suppers, parties, or pancakes become another way of missing the point. We don't do these things out of obligation. We do these things out of anticipation. The fasting has no spiritual value in and of itself. It only has value as a means to an end. The goal of fasting is not fasting, nor is it earning favor with God (as if that were possible). The goal of fasting to help to focus our spiritual lives and help us focus beyond or own personal needs and desires. Fasting fosters self control and, as a spiritual discipline, can help us draw nearer to God. My prayer for the Christ Church family is that we will observe a holy Lent and find ways to deepen our life in Christ.
