15. A Biblical and Theological Primer, written by Dr. B.J. Norrix is in the translation phase of its publication. This book was written for the Nexus Seminary students in Uganda and will be printed in English and Lugandan. I have just learned that I may have a sponsor who will underwrite the entire cost of this project. Watch for more information. In the mean time . . . there are other projects to sponsor and support!. The total cost to publish the first 2000 copies of this book will be around 5-6,000 US dollars. Rev. Davis Matovu has also written a commentary on the Book of Revelation that we will be publishing as well. Total Cost of both projects is 8-10,000.

Biblical Resources in Lugandan are nonexistent. There is a Lugandan translation of the Bible that we provide for our graduates but actual Bible study materials do not exist. This produced the need for more materials. Rev. Matovu and Dr. BJ wrote their documents to respond to this need. We are hoping that these will be the first of many resources developed for the rural pastor in Uganda.

16. Coming Later in Lent:

Palm Sunday is April 1 – we will have a procession with palms and a reading of the Passion narrative.

Holy Thursday is April 5 – we will gather at 7:00 for an observance of the Last Supper (no Seder this year).

Good Friday is April 6 – we will have the Stations of the Cross at Noon and again at 7:00 p.m. Easter festival celebrations at 9:00 and 11:00 on April 8.

Christ Church is growing. We are seeing a steady stream of guests in worship (see someone you don't know? Remember to say "HI" and welcome!) and many of them are coming back and becoming a part of our family. I am especially excited because this is one of many critical signs that we are moving forward. The next sign is a bit more complicated. The number ONE indicator of a health church is the percentage of the congregation that is actively engaged in mission and ministry. I am convinced that EVERYONE is capable of doing SOMETHING. Whether it is sending cards or offering prayers; whether it is visiting the sick; whether it is hands on mission and outreach; or providing music, teaching children and adults, planting flowers or help, cooking food, helping with administration, etc.; whatever it is we are all capable of utilizing our spiritual gifts, our time and talents in ministry to and with others.

Here are Two needs I am exploring: 1) A "pastoral care team" – this would be a trained team of laity who would assist with nursing home and hospital and home visitation, carry communion to nursing homes and shut ins and generally augment the caring ministries of the church. I will be providing training. Is this what God has wired and called you to do? See me. 2) "Pastor's Prayer partner team" – we need to more intentionally and directly hold our church our churches leaders (and especially me) in our prayers. Are you a person of prayer? Is God calling you aside our church's leaders to provide prayer support? Again, see me.
