Hi Everyone:

We have entered the week the is the central pivot of our Christian Faith. From Palm Sunday through Resurrection Day, the heart of our story is told, retold and relived by Millions of Christians throughout the world. All of the teaching, all of the events of the Gospel, all the rest of our Christian faith is held together by the fabric of these events. My prayer for all of us is that we will make space this week to remember, retell, relive and experience the horrible, terrible, extraordinary, transformational events of the week. I am praying that each of us will make space to read, reflect and journey through special worship, prayer and other acts of devotion this week.

14. MISSION NEWS AND NOTES:

1. Hands for New York – this week's collection: **April 8 – crackers; April 15 – tuna/canned meats.**

The goal is to feed 1million people in 1 year (July to June). If each congregation in Upper New York Conference fed 1050 people we would reach our goal. Christ church will well exceed that goal knowing that some congregations will not be able to feed 1050!

- 2. UGANDA PROJECTS UPDATE:
- A. Dr BJ will be travelling to Uganda to continue his work with the Nexus Seminary this fall (October 1-October 17). The 2012 Uganda team: Rev. B.J. Norrix, Rev. William Mudge (Adirondack District Superintendent), Kathy Weaver and John Miller of Christ Church, Esther Keeney (of Pulaski) and Rev. Clair Mosher (Erieville and Ononativia United Methodist Churches in Onondaga County) **PLEASE KEEP us all in your prayers.**
 - B. I have three DVD's from last year's Uganda journey. I would be glad to lend them to you.
 - a. is me teaching a series of lectures on Palestine of Jesus time
 - b. is graduation in the village of Kikyusa.
 - c. is of the well project at Kirimandagi
- 3. **Habitat for Humanity**: Christ Church was one of the original Habitat Sponsors in Erie County. We continue our participation in several ways:
 - a. We contribute \$1000 annually to Habitat
 - b. We have several women who participate in the WOMEN BUILD
- c. We will be helping with the Restore on "Make a Difference Be the Church Sunday" on May 20.
- 15. <u>A Biblical and Theological Primer</u>, written by Dr. B.J. Norrix is in the translation phase of its publication. This book was written for the Nexus Seminary students in Uganda and will be printed in

English and Lugandan. We are planning to distribute the first copies of this book in October 2012. The total cost to publish the first 2000 copies of this book will be around 5-6,000 US dollars. Rev. Davis Matovu has also written a commentary on the Book of Revelation that we will be publishing as well. Total Cost of both projects is 8-10,000.

Biblical Resources in Lugandan are nonexistent. There is a Lugandan translation of the Bible that we provide for our graduates but actual Bible study materials do not exist. There is a deep need for more and better materials in the native language (Lugandan). Rev. Matovu and Dr. BJ wrote their documents to respond to this need. We are hoping that these will be the first of many resources developed for the rural pastor in Uganda.

There can be no pinnacle of joy without the depth of sorrow and despair. To put it another way, we only truly appreciate the pinnacle of joy when we have been immersed in the depths of sorrow. Holy Week is a roller coaster ride. We soar with the crowds on Palm Sunday with cries of "Hosanna and Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" Then comes Wednesday and Judas sells Jesus for 30 pieces of silver and we sink a bit. Thursday arrives and we rise to the great blessing of the first Last Supper but the dinner turns funny, somehow, and the conversation is scattered around "who's the greatest" and who will or won't betray Jesus and the dire prediction of Peter's denial. John succinctly records the state of Judas soul in John 13:30 "So, after receiving the piece of bread, he immediately went out. And it was night." There is the evening of not being able to stay awake in the garden with Jesus and all the while Jesus is agonizing, painfully pouring his heart out to his Father in prayer but always returning to: not my will but thy will be done. The betrayer betrays Jesus with a kiss and we sink. There is the mock trial at Caiaphas' home. The beating, mockery and the trip to Pilate's office and the fear grows and our hearts sink even lower. Jesus is condemned, he is nailed to the Roman torture stake known as the cross (it was such a painful way to die the Romans invented a new word to describe it – excruciating (pain as from the cross). Jesus dies. Jesus is buried in a borrowed tomb with a big stone rolled in front. This is the pit of sorrow, the depth of frustration, the lowest of the low. There is Saturday that comes and goes (not all of the roller coaster ride is up and down). Then comes Sunday, the first day of the week. Matthew tells us "an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it! (Matt. 28:2). Then hope rises, confusion ensues . . . and new life becomes possible. Imagine all of the stones of all of the tombs of all of our lives being rolled back and sat upon . . .
