Finance Update

Thank you for your continued support through this time. The prayers, words of encouragement, efforts to remain connected and engaged in ongoing opportunities for faith, love and service are inspiring. Our primary concern remains the health and welfare of the community.

Suspending all activities in and of Christ Church within our physical building was a challenging decision, but we know it was the right one. While we knew this would minimize some expenses in a reduction of utility use, we understood this action would have consequences to our fiscal health and ministry plan through lost revenue in groups meeting at the church and weekly giving. Through careful financial management, Christ Church remains in a sound position with 6-9 months of financial reserves for maintaining current expenses. The decision was reached to take the endowment disbursement early to inject further capital, providing additional security through these uncertain

times. Also, initially we committed to maintain all staff of Christ Church at full compensation through April 20, 2020.

The Church Council will be meeting via Zoom this coming Tuesday as we begin to strategize through mid- and long-range planning, which will explore the impact not only to this year's ministry plan, but likely many more beyond.
