Hi Everyone:

Today is the Feast of All Fools (aka April Fool's Day) a day anchored in the murky past of hazing rituals as one of the rites of passage into spring. It is a day for pranksters and jokesters and general foolishness. Being the serious minded and emotionally sober human being that I am, I find April Fool's day to be in rather poor taste and a profound waste of energy. I mean, seriously, how could we lower ourselves to a day of silly tricks and goofy jokes? I find the whole thing a deplorable waste of time and energy and encourage all of us to get back to the somber work of faith and life. This faith experience should only be done by SERIOUS people! (OK, April fool's!) Our ability to play and to create amusement is one of the vital characteristics of being human. When Jesus cries (on all three occasions 1) the death of Lazarus in John 11; 2) over Jerusalem in Luke 13; 3) and in the Garden of Gethsemane) it is somberly recorded in the Bible. But the bible never says "and Jesus laughed." It never says "and when Jesus saw what the disciples were doing he had to hold his sides he was laughing so hard." I believe that being the perfect human being the reason "Jesus laughed" is never recorded is because it would have been stating the mundane, the routine the obvious. I believe

that Jesus normal demeanor was joy and humor and laughter. It sneaks into his teaching "why removed the speck of dust from your brother's eye when you have a log hanging out of yours?" It is one of the reasons people follow him. He was likeable. He was playful. While his disciples are busy with serious business of following the Messiah, Jesus has the equally busy task of "keeping them loose" and on point and engaged with the world around him. So, in honor of the Feast of All Fools and our laughing savior . . . allow yourself to be playful today! Deeply spiritual relationships are playful it is only the terminally religious that have to be serious all the time.

Parting Thought:

In the past 20 years there has been an amazing upsurge in books, movies, television shows, games, etc. that are related to Vampires, Ware wolves, demigods (aka Thor) and Zombies. It is such a huge phenomenon it has me wondering: "Why?" What emptiness, what need, what unfulfilled fantasy or desire is being filled by these presentations? They all have something in common: immortality. In the case of Vampires, Ware wolves and Zombies there is some sort of blood transference that creates a permanent change in the other. One becomes what the "biter" is. The preoccupation with immortality is pretty clear: human beings have an innate desire to overcome their mortality. We are incurably spiritual creatures who desire to be reunited with our creator. Is it possible that the church has so profoundly failed in our time and age to speak to this essential human need that we have filled the void, not with resurrection and eternity but with transformation to darkness and a "twilight half life" for eternity? C.S. Lewis once wrote that "if I find in myself a desire for which nothing in this world can satisfy the only logical conclusion is that I was made for another world." Could it be that the message of hope and the passing on of the Christ presence in others is being replaced by this fantasy of consuming others? The Bible says the life is in the blood. The Christian Church has said through the ages that the blood of Christ redeems us. Perhaps, the degeneration of this uplifting transformation message has become this modern

preoccupation with the undead . . . things to ponder as we look to the story of Lazarus this week.
