Getting Gas

My car informed me that I had 40 miles left I could travel before I would be out of gas. It seems never a convenient time whether by virtue of a need to meet the school bus at home, run off to the hospital, or just less than optimal conditions for standing outside. Why is it that the gas station is the coldest, windiest, rainiest, snowiest place? However, it is either honor the need or end up stranded.

Holy Week is a time when it can feel as we journey through it that the needle is creeping toward empty. Whether that is due to the exhaustion of emotions evoked as we walk alongside Jesus, recalling the final days of his life, or a general weariness in the face of churches burned in Mississippi or the recent images of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris engulfed in flames, we ponder where our faith stands in the midst of challenge. How much further can we go? What more can we take? What does it all amount to? How will we have enough to make it?

They are not easy questions. In fact, they may be easier just to ignore. We risk being stranded if we are inattentive or unwilling to face reality. Holy Week asks of us to honor the need to ask the question, to seek the answer or end up stranded.

Just when we think we can go no further, as we stand in our darkest moment in the coldest time, dawn will come. Christ will fill us with hope and peace as the Holy Spirit guides us on. We may not have all the questions answered, but we will have all we need to continue the journey.
