Leaf Buds

We admired the aliveness all around us as we walked the dog on a recent evening. Bird chorus cheering on the verdant shades of green everywhere filled the air. As late evening light provided its own colorful backdrop, we came upon this tree with its branches raised to the sky close to the sidewalk. We admired nature's magnificence in the leaf buds about to unfurl to begin the important process of nutrient consumption and conversion.

With snow back in our forecast and floating in the air, its easy to fall into a state of gloom alongside of the temperatures. We forget so quickly these signs of spring or worry anxiously about the impacts to tree and flower. Dragging the shovels back out of garage and shed, we mutter our 'why?' heavenwards. Truthfully any number of



factors can cause these feelings and emotions to arise even on the hottest and sunniest of summer days, let alone the dark cold snowy ones. In these moments we do well to remember the challenge the disciples had when Jesus spoke of his death.
