#### Hi Everyone:

I still seem to be in the crazy time between knowing I'm moving, announcing I'm moving, announcing who is replacing me and actually "getting on with it." You'd think with a job that by definition is itinerant that this moving thing would be routine, but I just don't seem to get used to it. I know some of you have lived in the same place for 4 or 5 decades and some of you (Roger) moved more in some years than I have in my entire life, so I suspect that my moving adventures are in the middle somewhere. I lived in the same house for my first 18 years. Had the same dorm room for 3 years, moved every year for the next two, lived in the same apartment for 3 years, my first parsonage for 2 years, my second for 4 years, my third for 12 years before we bought our own home and lived there 11 years before coming to Amherst for the last 4 years and now back to that home. So that makes 11 moves in my lifetime (so far). I'm beginning to think the Old Testament statement "my father was a wandering Aramean. . .(Deuteronomy 26:5)" may have applied to United Methodist Clergy — "my pastor is a

wandering Methodist . . .". No matter how many times I move certain things are unchanged. My life revolves around the fixed point of my relationship with Jesus Christ which only grows and deepens over the years. And, quite frankly, home is wherever Karen happens to be.

**FOCUS of Mission:** We will be working with two clinics (at Lusanja and Nabukondo) we will be leading two Nexus graduations (at Rakai and Nakasangola) we will be working on a church building at a school and holding at least one youth rally. We will be dedicating a new well (at Gombe) and a new church at Seeta. There will be time taken to visit the source of the Nile river in Jinja and a Game Preserve near Rakai.

HERE'S A WAY TO ENHANCE YOUR BIBLE READING: Try keeping a Journal. Sometimes, when you are reading, something in the reading will speak to you or stand out to you. Take a moment and write down the SCRIPTURE. Then make an OBSERVATION (what spoke to me??). Thirdly, ask "How would I APPLY this to my life. Finally, make what you learned into a PRAYER. This method of Bible reading is called the S.O.A.P. method and allows us to ask "how will I be different because of what I just read?"

## **Parting Thought**

We are half way through the Easter Season (50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost). We have been looking at how Jesus self-defines in the Gospel. Who do people say Jesus is matters; who do his followers say Jesus is also matters; but what really matters is who Jesus says he is. I find that when we focus on his self-defining statements, we lose a lot of the ambiguity. Jesus is very clear about who he claims to be. He claims to be the Son of God. He claims to be "sent from God". He claims to be Resurrection, Life, the Way, the Truth and the Life, The Gate, The Bread of Life, the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep, etc. These are profoundly significant claims. Jesus leaves us with some fairly limited choices. He either is all of these things or he is not. We can speculate and we can probably dance around a few of these claims but the bottom line is sharply defined. If Jesus is NOT the Way or the Resurrection or the Bread of Life or the Gate or, for that matter, the Son of God, then we would be best served walking away and finding something else to do with our time. If, however, Jesus is who he claims to be, then our response to that claim is the most important response we will make to anything in our entire lives.
