A Word From Pastor Daven

About the time you receive this, I will be winging my way to Iowa, looking upon the patchwork of land thousands of feet below. I will be returning to my spiritual birthplace in the sense of the church and baptismal font where my Christian journey began and the place which the people I draw my heritage from call home.

I go to say goodbye to the last of my relatives of a generation, in this case my grandmother. And I find there to be a poignant connection between her funeral and my spiritual birthplace. Led through the waters of grace in baptism, my faith tells me the grave is not the end. We go through these experiences for closure, to say goodbye, to be with family, but also because these moments are the ones to which our faith speaks most directly. As Christ comes and proclaims peace to the disciples in resurrection appearances, so these times of worship provide the same for us. We listen and find Jesus offering us peace, gifting us with the Holy Spirit, and sending us to share this with the world.

And so while filled with sadness at my loss, it is balanced with joy. I remember my baptism and am thankful. I hear Jesus offering peace and the Holy Spirit reminding me of all he said and taught as the words of resurrection hymns fill my head and heart.

"Christ is risen! Raise your spirits from the caverns of despair. Walk with gladness in the morning. See what love can do and dare. Drink the wine of resurrection, not a servant, but a friend; Jesus is our strong companion. Joy and peace shall never end. Christ is risen! Earth and heaven nevermore shall be the same. Break the bread of new creation where the world is still in pain. Tell its grim, demonic chorus, "Christ is risen! Get you gone!" God the First and Last is with us. Sing Hosanna everyone!" You are invited to join in 'Thirstaid' Thursdays each Thursday at 1 p.m. in the Wesley Room!


"Hope When Your Heart Breaks (Navigating Grief and Loss)"
