Hi Everyone:

The long, slow ascent into spring continues. My bulb flowers have figured out the season but the April showers seem to be a bit late. There is something irresistible and, dare I say, inevitable about the march of the seasons. New life is emerging all around us. It will emerge all around us. We can't make it happen, we can't really stop it from happening – it is totally out of our control. What we can do is enjoy the journey. We can celebrate the flowers and the flowering trees, the return of the leaves, the greening of the grass and the reemergence of life all around us. In the Christian community we easily lose sight of this. God is at work in the world. God is at work in the lives of people all around us -- for whatever reason we seem to have a difficult time seeing it. It may be that we are just so wrapped up in our own stuff and our own battles that we don't see the amazing emerging life all around us. Christ Church is becoming a birthing place. There are new believers in our midst.

There are newly renewed believers in the midst. We need to celebrate God at work. Here's what happens to me pretty much every year. I am wandering around grumbling about the rain, the cold, the delay of the warmer weather and then, suddenly, out of the corner of my eye I spy a splash of yellow or red or marvelous blue and I am distracted. I have to stop and take a closer look and admire these lilies of the field that out does the splendor of King Solomon. Whatever your current struggle might be, the new life among us is emerging. It is out there on the fringe; catch a glimpse out of the corner of your eye and you'll see it. It may not be moving in a directly obvious way but it is most definitely moving.

Here is what is happening at Church:

- 1. Last Sunday's attendance was 111. Through April this year our worship attendance is up nearly 10% over the same time period in 2013 (average of 159.7 compared to 146.1). We are making slow progress in spite of the rather horrible weather this past January/February/March our congregation is beginning to grow. When was the last time you invited a friend, neighbor, coworker, family member, total stranger to attend worship with you?
- 2. This Sunday for our Communion celebration I will be looking at the story from Luke 24 of two disciples' encounter with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. The highlight of the incident is where Jesus is "made known to them in the breaking of the bread (Luke 24:35)." A lot of energy has been wasted trying to explain the mechanics and processes of Communion. Like most matters of faith there is a profound sense of mystery. The communion table is a place to which we are invited and at which we encounter our risen Lord. It is a place where Jesus reveals himself in the breaking of bread and sharing of the cup.

Davis is married to Samale and they have two children, Joan and Jesse.
