HERE'S A WAY TO ENHANCE YOUR BIBLE READING: Try keeping a Journal. Sometimes, when you are reading, something in the reading will speak to you or stand out to you. Take a moment and write down the SCRIPTURE. Then make an OBSERVATION (what spoke to me??). Thirdly, ask "How would I APPLY this to my life. Finally, make what you learned into a PRAYER. This method of bible reading is called the S.O.A.P. method and allows us to ask "how will I be different because of what I just read?"

On the First of June, I will make available copies of our Bible Reading Plan for the rest of the year. You may contact Janelle in the church office or copies will be on the ledge in the back of the Sanctuary.

Parting Thought

I love it that Easter is not just a day but a season. Easter Season stretches from Easter Sunday for 50 days (to Pentecost). The amazing power of the resurrection is too important and too central to our faith to only celebrate one Sunday a year. In fact it is too big to limit it to 50 days. An Avery and Marsh song says "every morning is Easter morning from now on!" Which I certainly agree with. As Easter people, as people of the resurrection, we become people of deeply held and amazingly awesome HOPE. At the heart of the Easter message is a message of

salvation, grace and freedom. There is also a message of resurrection power arriving to give us the power to overcome the things that try to hold us down and keep us back. It is the heart and soul of Christianity. The message of Christmas is that God became a human being and lived among us. The Message of the Gospel is that this God Incarnate, Jesus Christ, walked among us, healed the sick, ate with sinners, challenged the religious energy and apathy of his time. The message of Good Friday is that Jesus made his life an offering for the world. The message of Easter gives everything I just wrote substance and meaning. There is no direct power in another dead martyr. There is no direct power in the words of one more itinerant preacher. But there is power, amazing, wonderful, life changing power, in the message of Christ Risen, indeed! I pray and every one of us, young, old and everywhere in between, will embrace this amazing power and live into a whole new reality!
