Hi Everyone:

I'm getting ready for the 2nd Hand2Plow laity gathering. It is being held on Saturday this week at Camp Asbury. Several of us have been reading a book titled "Experiential Worship" by Bob Rognlien in preparation for this gathering. Bob suggests that worship is a full self experience – that is to say worship is an offering of our heart, soul, mind and strength. Worship should engage our heart our will our bodies our intelligence, in short, our entire selves. This can be difficult. Congregations exist in sub cultures. The small country church may focus on the language of the heart. The urban church may focus more on the body and will. The highly educated suburban congregation may find, over history, that it has a primary focus in matters of the mind – an appeal to intelligence. Rev. Rognlien suggests that these major foci are not the problem. The problem is that we need to offer all of our selves. The emotional worship experience needs to think more. The thinking worship experience needs to feel more. The activist congregation might need to discover a life of prayer. The book has been very helpful. Some of what the author is talking about we are already working on. Other aspects of his book are quite challenging. The bottom line for us to develop authentic worship of God that encourages us to engage at all levels of our being. We have a few extra copies of the book if anyone is interested in taking a look. Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School boasts many distinguished alumni – including Dr. Martin Luther King, two of my covenant brothers (Aaron Bouwens and Bill Mudge) and my wife, Karen Bellimer. Our own Jim Pollard serves on their Board of Trustees.

I was privileged to hear Dr. McMickle preach at Upper New York Annual Conference this past June. He gave the finest ordination sermon I have ever heard. Bring your friends and family and neighbors, etc.

Alcohol and gambling of any form are not permitted on United Methodist church property. Thank you to all of you who have supported the Lim Marcantonio family in this adventure.

Parting Thought

The Going Deeper group is currently reading <u>The Great Divorce</u> by C.S. Lewis. This book is not about ending a marriage. The title comes from the older language in the Biblical story of the Rich man and Lazarus (see Luke 16:19ff) that describes an "uncross able gulf" (divorce) between heaven and hell. In this little book we read a parable of group of people from the "grey towns" (aka hell) who take a bus ride to heaven. Everyone on the bus is given the opportunity to stay in heaven and be transformed all they need to do is to let go of the thing or idea or attitude that is keeping them in hell. The issues

range from self righteousness (no need for God's grace I only want what I've earned) to thinking that somehow heaven is a prize to be attained rather than the consequence of a life lived in relationship with God. The premise that Lewis is working with is that the gates of Hell are "locked from the inside." It is the investable conclusion of a lifetime of choices. I have often wondered what are the ideas, concepts, presuppositions, etc. that are keeping me from seeing a new reality? What are the things I desperately cling to that are keeping me from a deeper transformational relationship with my creator through Jesus Christ? If God were to say to me, like he says to the Rich Young Ruler in Luke 18:18ff, you only lack one thing . . . Would I be able to let go of the one thing, the one idea, the one bigotry or world view or material possession that is keeping me from living fully into the Kingdom of God? The book presents such an intriguing challenge along these lines. We meet on Sundays at 6:30 at the Church (resuming April 21) and the group is open to any and all. Not to ruin the end of the story but most of the people get back on the bus and return to hell – the challenge is understanding why.
