A word from Pastor Darryl

We have just concluded the half-way point of our Sermon Series on "Miracles and Multitudes" using the common lectionary readings on the Gospel of John chapter 6. As Jesus lives out his life and ministry among the multitudes following him and gathering around him he extends an offering of life-giving bread! The last two Sundays our offering centered on the sub-topics of "Inward Hunger" and "Life-Giving Bread" respectively. Our discipleship living is a journey, and we need food, we need strength for the journey. I posed this question relating to the first topic: Do you find yourself running on empty sometimes, bogged down in the ordinariness of life? Maybe it's time to eat. The food of life, the food for the soul is all around us, especially present in our church. It's in the people who sit beside you, in the light that shines through these stained glass windows, the songs we sing, the prayers we offer, in the very breath of our bodies. Our inward hunger is in the ordinary things, the daily miracles that we take for granted. I encouraged us to renew our faith and trust in the One who has claimed us by hearing his words afresh, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

This past Sunday I also encouraged us to reflect deeply on ways in which we offer life-giving bread to others around us. The religious people grumbled at Jesus' claims. As a youth I grumbled because I wanted new shoes but then I saw a person with no feet. We heard of the life-changing stories of young people on a mission trip to the Appalachian region here in the USA. These young people give clothing from off their backs and the shoes from their feet and left it for other children except for what they had to use to travel back home. Our children, our young people are showing us the way. And in the midst of all the grumbling and fussing at Jesus' claim that *He is the life-giving bread from heaven* I reminded us that it was just a day or two before all that fussing and fighting that a child shared his lunch of five barley loaves and

two fish. Our children are watching us and leading the way Jesus offers us life-giving bread so that we might transform the world! What are we going to do about it?

A team of us from Christ Church – Sally Pollard, Janelle Martin, Sandy Cumming and yours truly had an enriching experience at the Global Leadership Summit last Thursday and Friday in Rochester NY. There is lots to share from the Summit – I will share more in the next issue of The Caller. What stayed prominent in my mind during all the exhilarating and uplifting sessions is the conviction that we as a church need to have some *courageous conversations* about the *creative, courageous and contagious ways* we might shift how we do church, that is, how we practice our faith to reach others with Christ's love and service in the *21*st *century*.

Last but not least, many thanks for sharing Birthday Greeting cards (some really humorous ones – I laughed my socks off!). Although I was at the Summit for part of last Friday – the day of my birthday I had a wonderful day! As always, I am praying for you and with you daily.
