We fulfilled another longtime hope of my daughter Amelia with a rugged overnight camping trip. Trying to remain physically distant from others, this meant an absence of conveniences taken for granted (running water, bathrooms, etc.). Everything that we would need, we would pack-in and carry. No such trek is complete without a long, technical hike, ideally with the reward of a view.

Throughout the biblical narrative encounters with God often occur on mountaintops, where the perceived proximity between heaven and earth are minimal. Whether its Moses receiving the law, Elijah hearing the still small voice, Jesus going to pray, or the transfiguration before the disciples, these high places seem to heighten senses leading to revelations and renewed commitments. Is this really the result of that thin veil between



heaven and earth being nearly transparent in such high places or the physical demand required to reach these places - the views they afford, our openness to sit in the quiet after such an undertaking, exhausted and so differently-abled to absorb everything around us?

Too often mired in day-to-day living we get caught up just looking at our own feet and situation, missing the views all around us. There is a concept called the 'balcony view' which essentially means taking that step back to see a more complete view / perspective. Maybe that's really what these biblical moments and even such personal experiences lend, an ability to see a more complete view. We don't need to head off camping to the mountains and woods to gain such perspective. We need only, like Jesus, to take some time away to pray to

see again that this world really is an amazing place and worth all our time and energy to save.
