## Hi Everyone:

I noticed that some American church foundation has declared September 14 as "National Back to Church" Sunday. Nice idea. The foundation promotes this with videos about how to "go back to church" and for churches on how to welcome those returning. The flaw in the idea is the assumption that everyone goes "back to church." What about the significantly high percentage of Buffalonians who have never, in any intentional way, been to church? Even so there is merit in declaring a "general amnesty" for those who have wandered away from worship for a few months or more extended time. People leave for a variety of reasons: personal issues, someone said something and their feelings got hurt, don't like the new pastor, didn't like the previous pastor, the music is too loud (or not loud enough) or too old or too new or "I've been coming for 25 years and they keep singing the same unfamiliar hymns" or the pastor mumbles his punch lines or

seems to talk about Jesus too much (or not enough). So, here is my proposal. No matter how long you've been away, no matter why you left, no matter why you have stayed away, we at Christ Church promise to NOT SAY "where have you been" and WILL SAY "it is great to see you! Welcome home". Spread the word and prepare to welcome and be welcomed any Sunday but specifically on September 14. It would be a great day to invite new friends and old, neighbors, co-workers, golf buddies, sewing circles, and random strangers to join us for worship and check out this Jesus person and who he claims to be.

Here is what is going on at Church:

- 1. Attendance last Sunday was in the low 80's. We finished the 7 attitudes that kill the soul and are no longer slothful. Special appreciation goes to Kathy Weaver (guest Liturgist) Lisa Lawson (guest children's moment provider) and Adam Baber (guest organist). Everyone did a great job!
- 2. This Sunday I am preaching a message titled "Inside Out". Religion brings change to a person's life by imposing laws that control behavior from the outside. Following Jesus is about being remade from the inside out. As we become more Christ-like our inner nature is transformed and this transformation is revealed in a change in our values, priorities, attitudes and behaviors. Take a look at Romans 12:1-2 and Matthew 7:15-20.

1. **UGANDA 2014**: Pastor BJ Norrix and Joe Fort are under *6 weeks* away from their mission journey to Uganda and Kenya (depart October 5 return October 23). Please keep them and our Ugandan partners in your prayers as they

## **Parting Thought**

I have a confession to make. Here it is. I am not a very patient man. I don't like to wait in line, I don't like to sit in traffic and I want things to be the way I want them to be and I want them to be that way yesterday. I have found that my growing edge, spiritually, is actually learning to wait. I have found in my 30+ years of ministry that I need to wait for several things before I can proceed with what I think my plans might be. First I need to wait on God. I don't do anything for God

(and neither do you). Biblically God works through us. God uses my voice, my hands, my feet to do some amazing things but I must remember that it is God who is at work in and through me. Therefore, I have to wait for God's hand to move me. I do this waiting in prayer, in bible study, in spiritual conversations, in worship and in accountable relationships. These are the themes of my messages through September. I have also discovered that I have to wait for God to move in other people as well. No one flies solo on the Christian journey. God moves in me and God moves in others and discovering that movement in others is how new life and new possibilities begin to emerge. It is quite exciting and, at the same time, can be profoundly frustrating (because, as Freddy Mercury so aptly put it "I want it all, I want it all, I want it all and I want it NOW!") But, I am learning. The Bible (in Isaiah) says "they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength. . ." I am learning and I find that the better I get at waiting the stronger my spirit grows.
