November! Doesn't seem possible, but Thanksgiving and Advent are just around the corner. The fall has been full of new plans & new directions and I can feel us moving forward "on the road" to somewhere. It's a good feeling.

In our FaithXpress learning about festivals Jesus observed in his Jewish household, we've discovered that light is an important symbol. Lamps appear in the Torah and the Bible as a symbol of lighting the way for the righteous, for the wise, and for love and other positive values. In Jewish festivals observed today two candles are always lit...one for remembrance and one for observance or to practice in one's life God's commandments. We have two candles on our worship table reminding us to do the same, believing that Jesus light is present with us showing us the way. Light is given a positive spiritual meaning. The oil lamp and its light were essential household items, which may explain the symbolism.

Now as we come to Advent, a time of watching, waiting, and hoping, it's a time to be prepared for the unexpected, for the new thing God is doing in our lives. It's a time to give up on the illusion that things will always be the same and move forward in straight lines and familiar patterns. It's time to accept the fact that life will not go on as it has, that change is coming and no one knows what direction it will take. History shows us likelihood, possibilities, and the unexpected. Faith shows us watchful expectancy for God's work and purpose. The danger is in hijacking the future by seeking our own agenda, being shortsighted, distracted and going off course. Thomas Merton writes in Thoughts In Solitude, these helpful words, "My God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope that I have that desire in all that I am doing. ... And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore I will trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me....

I love the seasons. I love the cycles. I love the ebb and flow of the spiritual life. I love that I am always connected to Jesus – that never changes. I also love that everything else (and I mean *everything* else) is in a constant state of change. What season are you in? Revel in the continuing cycle. We move from fruit, to discarding to rest, and, finally, to renewal. In our essential wiring we know this. We love the sameness of the seasons... and we love the fact that even though it looks much like last year, we experience it new and marvelously different every year.

God's grace is calling each of us to move in, move on, and move through our current spiritual season. That is to say, we are called to continue to grow.

The frosts of November are upon us...enjoy! This is but another season on our journey to renewal.


