Look Again!

The holidays come upon us in the dark time of the year as seasonal depression affects many, along with reminders of loss, unresolved family issues, and financial expectations creating stress and emotional turmoil. As the church,

we're called to take this wide range of human experience and offer an alternative vision. So, here we go again!

No matter how many Advent/Christmas seasons we've experienced, there are new wonders to explore and discover, IF we're willing to read and engage the scripture stories with new eyes and expectant hearts. God's word has more layers and depth than you or I are likely to fathom in a lifetime. That's why study and discussion groups in our faith community are so valuable. The more people in the room, the more experience and understanding of God we bring together. No matter how many times we may have heard the Advent /Christmas readings, there is something new awaiting. It's like the anticipation of an upcoming trip. Even if we've been there before, things will have changed since our last visit. Actually...WE have changed. And so we come with excitement, ready to look again.

In the church year, Advent starts us on a journey observing the birth, growth, ministry, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus through Luke's telling. If we look again, we find that Advent doesn't just lead us to Christmas, but through Christmas to Epiphany and on to Pentecost in one progression. When Jeremiah declared, "The days are surely coming..." he didn't just mean the day of Jesus' birth, but the full revealing of God for which we wait. Jesus' birth is just one step on the journey of fulfillment. And the journey is not unique to Jesus. All creation is called to learn and relearn how to be one with the holiness of God. Look again at the active participation of the crowds, the community, all of humanity, in God's unfolding saving history. Jesus didn't come just to show us how special he is, but what is possible for US to become right here and now. Look again.

FROM BJ'S DESK...

There is something majestic in the simplicity of the Christmas story. It is not complicated. The creator of the universe became a human being and lived among us. We can have a great conversation in discussing all of the reasons why the creator of the universe did this, but the simplest answer is

this: to show the fullest expression of love. Christmas is about the love of a creator for his creation. Christmas is about a love so amazing and so great that the creator would send his only begotten son to be one of us.

There are layers of simplicity in the story. God does not send his son to be born into a family of wealth. God does not send his son to be born into a family of royalty of high standing. God sent his son to be born of a peasant woman in a tiny village in a back eddy of the Roman Empire. Jesus was born into simplicity itself. It is a story that is humble and compassionate, and personal and life-changing.

What could be simpler than the tiny village of Bethlehem? What could be more human than the humble surroundings of an animal shelter and a young couple making do with what they had and making the arrival of their first born child as safe and secure as they possibly could with bits of cloth and piles of hay and a wooden feed box called a manger. Simple shepherds watching their sheep are the first to be told of the miracle in their midst.

That's the picture: a lamp-lit tableau of a wooden feed box holding a new born child with his mother attending her new born and father standing watch nearby. What could be simpler?

My hope and prayer for all of us would be a return to this simplicity. My hope and prayer is that we will make the space in this Advent/Christmas season to turn off the noise, to tune out the distractions, to dial down the busyness, and simply find space and time to adore the new born savior of the world.

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE

We'd like to alert you that 2012 Annual Statements will look different from past years. This is due to the fact that our Pledge Year is now 5/1/12 thru 4/30/13, but the statement is done on an annual basis, 1/1/12 thru 12/31/12.

You'll note that offerings made 1/1/12 thru 4/30/12 show as Non-Pledge Offerings and those made 5/1/12 thru 12/31/12 show as Pledge Offerings, if you pledged for that period. The pledge amount shown on the statement equals 2/3 (8 mo.) of your total annual pledge. The remaining 1/3 (4 mo.) of your pledge is due by 4/30/13 and will show on your 2013 statement.

To complicate matters further, your Boiler Fund pledges are on an annual basis (Jan.-Dec.) and the pledged amount shown represents the 2012 portion.
