### FROM BJ'S DESK...

I've been thinking and praying about dreams lately. Not the kind of dreams we have in the night that look like our readings from the book of Revelation, but the kind of dreams that get us out of bed in the morning and motivate us through all kinds of situations. I've been dreaming about Christ Church. I've been pastor

here for nearly a year — it seems longer because I knew so early in the process that I was coming here. We have seen some new dreams emerging and I sense a renewed sense of hope and excitement in the body. How are your dreams? Harry Chapin, who died tragically in a car accident over 25 years ago, was a singer and songwriter who told stories through his songs. My favorite album of his was a recording titled "Greatest Stories Live." There is a song on that album that asks the question "where do broken dreams go?" and then proclaims "you're supposed to dream when you are young." As emotionally moving as this song can be, I refuse to believe that is true. We often make it true with our disconnections and our acquiescence to the pressures and expectations of life, but I refuse to believe it. Acts 2 (the Pentecost story) has Peter quoting the Old Testament prophet Joel. Joel dreams of a time when the Holy Spirit will be poured out on everyone and the consequence is that both young AND old will see visions and dream dreams.

Dreams carry the power of change. Dreams move the lethargic and the apathetic to get moving and to reengage. Dreams move individuals, families, and communities to attempt the unlikely (dare I same impossible) in the hope, however, faint, that a better thing is on the other side. Dreams are sometimes called visions in the night — those pictures of a preferred future that inflame our souls and form our minds and drive our actions. Christ Church, what are your dreams?

I dream. I dream of serving a church that is profoundly and unashamedly in love with Jesus Christ. I dream of leading a church that understands that love of Jesus is shown and lived out in our love for others (inside as a faith community and outside in mission). I dream of a church that is rooted in the Tradition of the faithful who lived and died before us while simultaneously striving to connect with the real world as it exists in the here and now. I dream.

I should end this with some comment about "sweet dreams." But dreams are only sweet when they are realized. Instead my blessing is for us all to have big dreams that motivate and transform us.

**Peace with Justice Sunday-June 3** "Changing the world one life at a time" The 1980 General Conference created a church-wide Peace with Justice Program assigned to the General Board of Church and Society. By 1984, Peace with Justice ministries had sprung up throughout the church.

The 1984 General Conference voted to support the program with an annual offering on World Order Sunday, established half a century ago to build recognition and support for the work of the United Nations. The 1988 General Conference established Peace with Justice Sunday as the first Sunday after Pentecost to give churches a single, more convenient date for the offering and a name that clearly identifies the ministries it supports. Your generous contributions support the annual conference with 50 percent of the receipts for Peace with Justice Ministries within the conference. The conference board of church and society or an equivalent structure administers these funds. The remaining 50 percent is used for Peace with Justice Ministries related to the General Board of Church and Society.

Summer Fun Theme Weeks


This program runs for five weeks during the summer. Each week has its own theme, and all activities relate to it throughout that week. Students entering grades 1-9 may sign up for any combination of weeks. Between 40



and 50 youth participate each week divided by age into four groups. These groups rotate between four different stations each day, include recreation/reading, Gym/playground, a workshop, and either science, crafts, or waterslide. ### THE MISSIONAL CHURCH: THOUGHTS FROM DR. BJ

In our ever changing world there is much discussion about the nature and purpose of the Christian Church. The focus, style, and approach of the Christian church for the past 1600 years have been a station approach. The Church was a place you came to. The Church was a location in the community where we received religious goods and services. The Church was one of the key institutions in society that provided support and stability and produced good citizens. This style of church is called by historians the "Christendom" church. It is rooted in a theological understanding that church and state are working toward a common goal and a common purpose.

Christendom, which was born in the Constantine era (AD 300's), died in Europe and the United States sometime around World War II. The past 70 years have seen the Christian Church struggle to deal with the changing world views and the changing sociological understandings that once held it up and helped keep it going. In fact, the world we live in today is more like the world of the 1st Christian Century than any time since. We live in a society that looks more and more like the society of the Apostles. It is a society where many gods are worshipped openly. It is a society where the church and state have an uneasy truce but the privileges the Christian church enjoyed under Christendom are slowly eroding away. Churches around the world that understand this are moving forward with new and deeper understandings. At the heart of this is an understanding of the Church as Mission.

The Missional Church is deeply concerned about two (and only two) things. First, how do we fulfill the great commission to go and make disciples? The Mission Church is not interested in making members (except as a step toward becoming a disciple.) The Mission Church is not interested in running programs – it is interested in engaging ministries. Second, how do we extend the Kingdom of God? The Mission Church is always looking to fulfill its prophetic role by working to make our community a better place -- a place where "justice rolls like a river." A place where hungry are fed, naked are clothed, and opportunities are created for people to provide for themselves.

Making the transition from seeing the church as a place where people came to us, to a place where we go to where the people are, has not been easy. But those who have figured it out are remaking their ministries and living out their biblical purpose in the world as it exists today.
