

### Gotta Go to Galilee

Easter Sunday has come and gone and we're left to ask the question...what comes next? The women who came to the tomb on Sunday morning were focused on mourning. They had purchased oils and ointments to

anoint Jesus' dead body. But instead of mourning a death, they were shocked by an empty tomb and a messenger of God telling them to spread the good news, a message of new life! Jesus was now living a resurrected life!

Christian writer, C.S. Lewis wrote, "It may be hard for an egg to turn into a bird; it would be a jolly sight harder for it to learn to fly while remaining an egg. We are like eggs at present. And you cannot go on indefinitely being just an ordinary, decent egg. We must be hatched or go bad." The women, the disciples, and all of us who follow Jesus need to break out of the death grip that the world has on us and fly into the new life the resurrection offers. We've gotta go to Galilee.

The church, the body of Christ, is in a crisis of discipleship because more and more Christians choose to go back home to a safe, socially acceptable life instead of breaking into a resurrection life, a whole new way of living in the world. For Jesus, going to Galilee meant actually being alive, keeping a promise that ministry would go forward, a new start. For the women, going to Galilee would give them credibility when they shared the news with the disciples, the men, who probably wouldn't believe their outrageous story. For us... what will going to Galilee be for us?

Individual lives, communities, and the world are not as they could be. There is much reshaping, community building, and healing left to be done. Our relationship with the resurrected Christ is in process. We've gotta go to Galilee to meet the risen Jesus.

### Make a Difference - Be the Church

This idea came out of the Ginghamsburg United Methodist Church near Dayton, Ohio. The congregation made the decision not to invest in expanding their building and to invest in people. Their idea was to give the whole church an experience of not just attending a service of worship

but actually going out into the community and being the hands and feet of Christ at work in the world. This was considered a profoundly radical idea.

Last year Christ Church took its first foray into this worship/work approach by "Packing the POD" and providing material goods for some of our local mission projects. This great idea was accompanied with some visitation and other "reconnecting" projects in the Snyder and wider community. I can see that it had a very positive impact on the lives of those who worked on it, and it made a huge difference in the wider community.

This year we're taking it a step further. The idea is for every person connected with Christ Church to engage in a mission project on the 20th of May. To this end we have projects for the rugged: cleaning, gardening, helping at the Habitat restore. We'll have trucks on our property to collect old bicycles, clothing, and household goods, things to be shredded, etc. We have projects for the knitters, sewers, and cooks among us. We have projects for the handy person in all of us. I think we have something for everyone.

Christ Church is turning a corner and God is doing some great things in our church community. I've learned there are two things which transform churches faster than any others. One is Bible study. Studies show that people engaged in reading, discussing, and applying lessons from the Bible experience renewal. The second thing that transforms lives is mission engagement. When we as Christians get our hands dirty serving others, it not only helps those we serve, but it changes us as well. This is true whether we work in Africa, West Virginia, or Snyder, New York. When we freely give of ourselves, our time and our abilities, in helping others, it renews our hearts and moves us forward.

My prayer is that each and every one of us will make space for May 20 and will sign up and engage in one of the "Be the Church – Make a Difference" projects. I will be out there serving with you and praying for you each step of the way!

Adult/teen helpers will be needed at the 47 Ellwood site, off Genesee Street, from 9 am to 4 pm to set up tables and tents and sort the dry goods that will be dropped off by postal trucks and our drivers/collectors. We also

need drivers with vans, pickups, station wagons, etc. to help collect food from outlying areas (West Seneca for example), where postal delivery trucks will transfer their collected items to our drivers. Vans and pickups can use youthful passengers to help in the transfer. Sometimes drivers and youth assist the Postal Service by going from mailbox to mailbox. All folks start at 47 Ellwood for their assignments and some identification materials. The day goes fast, and lunch and beverages are provided. The Pantry is in need of bagged spaghetti also.
