Lost and Found

Mongo the cat is a regular addition to the staff of Christ Church. Actually, he is just a huge part of this community- participating in worship, showing up for meetings and choir, and helping to manage

the grounds. While he appeared midweek asking to be let in, after some conversation and a little affection, he quickly disappeared. He was later discovered comfortably curled up in the Lost and Found.

Mongo has a home and family while also being an active and regular part of Christ Church. But there was something about him in this bin that made me see an honest expression of life and faith. Maybe at its best that's what the church is — a place where however we feel lost or suffer loss we can be comfortable, cozy ... seen and ready to be found by the grace of God. During the time we have on this earth, as much as we might find and create a home, have a sense of belonging, we also as people of faith look to something beyond. We are both lost AND found. We reside in an odd in-between, now-and-not-yet reality as we apply our common prayer working to make earth reflect heaven little-by-little. And, as I saw in Mongo, the church is that place of belonging, that bin which holds us in the realities of the lost-and-found of life and living offering us just a little peace.



I know that not being able to physically gather, to inhabit the space of the church or delight in the fellowship and conversation of one another is exceptionally challenging. But maybe we can all find, if it is worshipping online, in daily prayer, or immersed in God's story, a sense of the security to let us curl up in coziness ever so briefly in the the confidence of one day being found by the grace of God in Christ.

NYS has created a color-coded system to indicate levels of COVID-19, with limitations imposed based upon color. Currently our region is in an 'orange zone', which limits our in-person gatherings for worship beyond those directly involved to 20 people.

We are inviting those interested in attending worship *in-person* to call or email the church office (839-2460) between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. each Friday prior to the weekend's service, with those 20 spots being reserved on a first-come-first-served basis.

If our region moves into a 'red zone', all in-person worship will be suspended.

We continue to offer online worship opportunities via Live-Stream on <u>our YouTube channel</u>, which is archived following its conclusion. While our hope remains to have in-person opportunities for Sunday worship, Music & Meditation on Friday evenings, and on Christmas Eve, we are committed to the health and safety of all people. We will follow all guidelines provided and strongly advise any who are nervous or feeling even slightly unwell to please stay home and worship virtually through this time.



Christmas Eve worship this year will be a Livestream / online only experience. This is based on the priority of people's health and safety in addition to our objective of offering a more complete experience than would be possible in-person.

The Christmas Eve service will Livestream on our YouTube channel first at 5 PM

on December 24th. Following the conclusion of the Livestream, it will be available on our channel at any time.

Music & Meditation Fridays, December 11 & 18 5:30 - 6 p.m.

Join us during the Advent season for 30 minutes of meditative songs, Scripture reading, and prayer in a quiet, candlelit setting.

Worship is now available on Sunday mornings at 10am, both in person and online!

Recordings of each service will also be available on our YouTube channel for viewing once the service has ended.

Please be advised of new guidelines for those wishing to worship together in person at Christ Church:

-All will be required to wear a mask. We will have a limited supply of masks on hand for those who come without one.

-Enter through one door at the main entrance.

-Use hand sanitizer at the provided station before entering the Sanctuary.

-Maintain social distancing (6 feet apart) from those not within your immediate family.

-Please do not enter the building if you are experiencing any symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, chills, diarrhea).
