We had an outstanding day "Making a Difference and Being the Church" yesterday. Our teams harvested and planted vegetables, prepared a flower garden, helped rehab a home, played with Journey's End children, served lunch at a women's shelter, made dresses, collected: electronics, bicycles, household goods and shredded documents. We also did some clean up of our neighborhood and served lunch and gave out cookies and did some tidying up around Christ Church as well. All in all a spectacular day! Highest appreciation to Sally Pollard, Rachel Vaughan, Peggy Bermudez and the whole "Make A Difference" Team. Thank you to all of our team leaders and the over 100 of us who showed up to make a difference yesterday. I was greatly and profoundly blessed! We want to thank the "weather committee" as well – sunshine and temperatures in the upper 80's made for a great work day. Thank you, everyone. The next step is to learn, improve and expand for next year. We are talking about a twofold "Make a Difference" event in 2013 that would happen in the late Spring (3rd Sunday in May) and a date in the early Fall (late September/early October). I don't know if everyone noticed it, but the senior staff at Christ Church certainly did. There was a special kind of energy in worship this past Sunday morning. In rebuilding a church community there are signs and watermarks (metrics if you will) that show you are on the right track. The rise in attendance in worship is very clear indicator that a corner has been turned and momentum in a positive direction has begun. The rise in participation in mission and ministry – we had over 100 Christ Church folks out making a difference. The rise in projects (and taking care of some old ones – like the Church sign, the boilers, etc) are an indication that there is a new level of hope and caring in the body (we don't invest in what we do not love – Jesus said where your treasure is there you heart will be). A deeper sense of community as expressed in caring for one another, encouraging one another, supporting one another and, as it grows deeper, being accountable to one another is another huge sign. The energy, enthusiasm, willingness to do whatever needed to be done are all indications that we are most definitely moving forward. I cannot describe how great it makes me feel to see the hopping energy on Sundays and the willingness to engage in mission and ministry.

When I first started conversations with the Christ Church community (beginning just over a year ago), most of you wanted to tell me about what was, and how it used to be. These were great stories of an excellent community of Christians seeking to be faithful in Snyder. I have noticed that many of you have begun to speak less about what was and more about what could be. I like that kind of thinking. We honor the past and those who provided this excellent ministry and facility for us. But we truly only hold it in trust for those who are coming after us. I am excited to build, to grow and to see where God is leading us into the future. Have a great week. And remember WEAR RED THIS SUNDAY FOR PENTECOST!!!
