## Hi Everyone:

I've been preaching through the fruit of the spirit (Galatians 5:22) since the first of the year. There are nine of them: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faith, gentleness (humility) and self control (temperance). Fruit is not worked for it is formed and grown. In the life of the Christ follower the fruit is grown in us through our living our lives in Christ and in Christian community. It is the byproduct of the life of faith. I am aware that it is harder to grow some things than others. Eggplant grew well in the parsonage side lot a few summers ago. Hot peppers and kale also grow well there. I didn't do so well with bell peppers. Tomatoes did exceptionally well (another night shade variety like the egg plant, I suspect). Causes for this are many: the amount of available water and sunlight; the condition of the seed or plant when it was planted; and, ultimately, the state and

fertility of the soil. These same conditions apply to fruit being formed in us as well. Some of the fruit of the spirit is formed easily: love seems to come easy and it is relatively easy for me to have faith. Other fruit forms with greater difficulty: patience is a struggle and, frankly, this week's "humility/gentleness" does not come easily either. The key to this process is to remember that it is a process. Some areas of our lives transform easily other areas of our lives transform with greater difficulty. Oh, and don't forget we are all different. What formed easy in me may be harder for others what is formed with difficulty in me may, in fact, be easier for others. I have long suspected that this is the reason for Christian community. Alone our strengths and weaknesses are glaring. In community we can work to our strengths and, together, can minimize our weaknesses.

What does it mean to be humble or meek? I suspect most of us identify these words with weakness (as, by the way, did the first century world). We get images of Caspar Milquetoast or some whimpering simpering self deprecating person who, on the best of days, would be described as spineless. What we learn when we study meekness and humility is something very very different. I will be looking at Philippians 2:1-11 as an insight into humility/gentleness/meekness.

# 14. SHOES Christ United Methodist Church Launches Shoe Drive to Support Microenterprise in Developing Nations, and Help the Environment

## The public is invited to Make A Difference by donating used shoes February 18 – May 18

Christ United Methodist Church is conducting a shoe collection drive on February 18 – May 18 to benefit small business ventures in developing nations and keeping old shoes out of local landfills. Individuals can help by donating used shoes at Christ Church.

In the US alone, approximately 630 million pairs of shoes are thrown away per year. The materials used to manufacture a pair of shoes are created from chemical compounds that create health hazards when left to disintegrate openly or in landfills. By donating your used shoes to the Shoe Drive, your shoes are given a second chance to make a difference. All donated shoes will be redistributed to microenterprise partners and used in developing nations for impoverished people to start, maintain, and grow a unique business opportunity to feed, clothe, and house their families. The additional advantage of this shoe collection is diverting shoes from the waste stream and landfills and creating commerce and sustainability in peoples' lives.

The shoe drive is just one part of Christ Church's annual "Make A Difference" Day, which takes place on Sunday, May 18. On site will be trucks collecting kitchen appliances for Habitat for Humanity, household goods to benefit Journey's End refugee resettlement, clothing for Asbury Shalom Zone located on the west side of Buffalo and a Shred-It truck provided by our community partner, Allaire Financial Strategies. Bring your old files and papers to be shredded onsite in a safe secure manner.

Members of the community are invited to make a difference in the lives of others by donating items no longer needed or wanted. ## **Parting Thought:**

A definition of insanity, usually attributed to Albert Einstein, says: "it is insane to believe that if you continue to do the same thing the same way eventually you'll get a different result." This quote shows up in lots of interesting places but the most popular is in conversations around church renewal and growth. Most of the main line congregations (of whom we are most definitely one) came of age at the end of the Christendom era in the United States. We were born of a time of volunteering and joining and when big institutions were the preferred and favored way to be about mission and ministry. As such we function very much like a command and control center that resists substantive change and new direction. Transformation is handicapped by a desire to return to what was or by those who are personally vested in maintaining the status quo (even if status quo is slow and inevitable death). The reality the Christian church faces today is that, at least in the United States, we are proclaiming the eternal message of the gospel in language, style and expectations that do not effectively reach post Christendom human beings. Christ Church carries some of the vestiges (but it is nowhere near as bad off as some churches I have worked with). The reality we face is that we have to be better, do better and communicate the gospel better and in ways that the generations coming up can understand. I have long suspected that the resistance to change is what is behind Jesus' metaphor of not putting new wine into old wine skins (Matthew 9:17). What do you think? Like Ezekiel (see chapter 37) we find ourselves asking can these dry bones live? We ponder the answer and wonder if there is any hope. Is there balm in Gilead? Is new life possible?

.... in case you are wondering. I believe the answer is YES!!! But it won't be easy. Pray with me, for me, and roll up those sleeves! And join the conversation, dreaming and planning on 2<sup>nd</sup> Mondays at 7:00 (next gathering is March 10).
