Hi Everyone:

Every church has as its core purpose to grow disciples for Jesus Christ. I've been having fun with the Hand2Plow training gatherings asking people to define what a disciple is. Generally we get stuck on what disciples do or on some nebulous attitude or belief. But Jesus defined his followers by the fruit they bore in their lives. That is to say the evidence of their discipleship was the natural outgrowth of how they lived. Fruit is not produced by the effort of a plant it comes from the plant staying connected to its source of nutrition, the sunlight, etc. It is another way the Bible reminds us that life is lived from the inside out. As our hearts and minds are transformed by the love and grace of Jesus Christ; as one's soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit through direct contact and exposure, the values, attitudes, behaviors and produce of one's life comes in alignment with the values of the reign of God that Jesus so frequently spoke about. I am changed from the inside out. Bearing fruit is not a mechanical process it is an organic process. This stage of lent if find it helpful to ask myself, am I connected, am I being nourished. What kind of fruit am I producing is a direct result of the kind of tree I am becoming.

Parting Thought

As I am preparing for this Sunday's message about "Telling your Story" I am reminded that everyone has a faith story to tell. At some point on this journey of faith we made a choice. For some of us this choice was made calmly and quietly and for others it was more dramatic and noisy. The intensity of the experience is not relevant. What is relevant is the difference Jesus has made in our lives. What difference has that made for you? I would like to know. For some of my friends the answer to that question is about radical change: Jesus helped me kick drugs or alcohol; Jesus helped save my marriage; without Jesus I would not be here today. For other of my friends the answer has to do with hope and direction: Jesus is the reason I try to make a difference in the world; Jesus is the center of my being; Jesus is my core philosophy and my reason for living. Regardless of the tag line every one of us who claim to be Christ followers (Christian) have a story to tell. It probably doesn't help that some people feel a need to condemn others with their version of the story; and it probably doesn't help that some people seem compelled to think that everyone should have the exact same experience in the exact same way. In Acts 1:8 Jesus tells his followers on Ascension Day that they are to be his witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and to the ends of the earth. Notice we are told to be witnesses, not, as one friend of my likes to put it, prosecuting attorneys. The role of the witness is simply to tell the story – what did you see and hear, what was your experience. In that sense all of us can witness to our faith. When asked we tell why we are who we are and why we live the lives we live.
