Hi Everyone:

Beginning the season of Lent is always something of an adventure. I am reminded that it is a time of self denial and renewed spiritual focus. In our profoundly self indulgent culture, Lent feels counter cultural to me. To be honest, I believe the whole message of the Gospel to be counter cultural. The world teaches us that the key to self fulfillment is to grab more than everyone else and always get your way. The Gospel reminds us that the key to self fulfillment is self denial and faithful service. This is a season to say "no" to otherwise permitted things so that we can more easily say "yes" to God. When I deny myself some indulgence I am reminded that the point of the denial is not random but is intended to remind me of the sacrifice Jesus made for me and to help me focus on my relationship with Jesus, others and myself. Make this a good Lent. Step away. Try fasting. One can fast from all kinds of permitted behaviors. One can give up favorite foods or beverages. One could fast from the media (turn the TV off for a day or two or a week) or from the internet or from movies. But denying myself is only part of the Gospel's road to self fulfillment. I also need to serve. Here are the critical service questions: What can I do to help someone else today? What can I do to encourage someone? What can I do to give someone a hand up? What can I do to reconcile with someone with whom I am broken. This is the Lenten adventure.
