A word from Pastor Darryl

Last Sunday we continued our Lenten journey toward the celebration of Easter Day with our theme of "Loving and Belonging" – reflections on Luke 13:31-35 where Jesus describes himself and God as a mother hen: "as a hen gathering her brood." We rarely, if ever, hear about God's femininity, female images for God, or female characteristics of God, and even then, the biblical truth will be hard to believe. If God is mostly assumed to be male, referred to with male pronouns, and described as male, then it will be more difficult, and take more energy to imagine God in female categories – and to believe that women have a place in the kingdom of God. Women need to hear themselves in the Bible, need to see themselves in the Bible. Why? Because, there are only 93 women who speak in the Bible, 49 of whom are named. These women speak a total of 14,056 words collectively – roughly 1.1% of the Bible. Mary, the mother of Jesus, speaks 191 words; Mary Magdalene gets 61; Sarah, 141 (Freeman, Bible Women: All Their Words and Why They Matter). We encounter an unusual symbol, metaphor that Jesus uses to identify himself – a mild, humble creature – a mother hen. It seems such a passive symbol for the Son of God, until we remember that he is also the One called the Lamb of God. Jesus describes himself as a mother hen, maybe so we don't expect to see him as an authoritarian power; that belongs in another realm – the other character in the gospel is Herod the fox – that is 'the power over' – predatory, sly and conniving is the implication there. But Jesus is portrayed as the mother hen gathering her brood under her wings. This is a power of a different sort, protective, merciful; the comforting, nestling, sheltering mercy of God.

Imagine God

-We have put up a huge picture of a cross in our Connection Cafe for us to put pictures and images around it that help us imagine who God is. We might draw pictures, or cut them from magazines and keep adding them until we have a collection of images that together give witness to how we imagine God at work in our world and lives. The goal isn't to get it "right," rather it's trying to articulate how we imagine God at work in our lives. My hope is that some

of the images might invite conversation, even cause a stir? I hope so. Because that's the point: the images aren't meant to define God – as if we could! Rather they are invitations for us to learn how to articulate our own faith and questions and imagination about God.

As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!
