### Hi Everyone:

We are into the season of Lent. How are you doing? Are you using the "cabin fever" weather to fret and worry or are you making some extra space to listen, to pray, to read or to engage in any of the other spiritual disciplines? I'm told that upstate New York and western New York cities are setting record temperatures for cold. My guess is a lot of the homes in the Buffalo area have some kind of ice damage and internal leakage. There is not much that can be done except to wait for the thaw and pray for warmer temperatures. Eventually the days will warm and the sap will flow and we'll move out of deep winter into the maple season. After this come the first crocuses and snow drops

and later the other bulbs. Soon after it will be early summer and strawberries and we'll move into the fruitful cycle of life in this part of the world. The best part about celebrating the changing seasons is the knowledge that they always change. I am learning to embrace change and it is not always easy. Someone, I can't remember who, once said that change is the only constant in the universe. I agree with that statement with one caveat: God. God never changes. Our perceptions, our understandings and our experiences of God may be constantly changing but God does not change. In the cycle of our ever changing world there is only one anchor. Are you making space this Lent to deepen your hold on the anchor (or allowing the anchor to take a deeper hold of you?)? Here's what I know from my own experience: the closer I get to God, the more willing I am to embrace change and to take great risks for His sake.

Here is what is happening at Church:

1. We had great improvement in our worship attendance this week (from 55 to nearly 90). One thing about this winter that deeply distresses me is how it is keeping people from participating in worship and the life of the community (come on spring!). My message was about not judging others.

There were almost 30 of us here for a cold and snowy Ash Wednesday.

HERE'S A WAY TO ENHANCE YOUR BIBLE READING: Try keeping a Journal. Sometimes, when you are reading, something in the reading will speak to you or stand out to you. Take a moment and write down the SCRIPTURE. Then make an OBSERVATION (what spoke to me??). Thirdly, ask "How would I APPLY this to my life. Finally, make what you learned into a PRAYER. This method of bible reading is called the S.O.A.P. method and allows us to ask "how will I be different because of what I just read?"

Red, in the movie Shawshank Redemption, as he finally leaves not only the walls of incarceration but the identity of incarceration, says, "I find I'm so excited that I can barely sit still or hold a thought in my head. I think it's the excitement only a free man can feel. A free man at a start of a long journey whose conclusion is uncertain. I hope I can make it across the border. I hope to see my friend and shake his hand. I hope the Pacific is as blue as it has been in my dreams. I hope." This was in response to his friend Andy who wrote in a letter to him: "Remember Red, hope is a good thing, maybe the best of things, and no good thing ever dies." What is your hope? For what do you dream? What better future motivates you? We live in a world that is in desperate need of hope filled and hopeful people.
