A Word From Pastor Daven

We will spend March in the darkened season of Lent. During it, our natural surroundings will begin their spring awakening (doesn't it feel like that right now?). Yet we are called spiritually to remain in a subdued penitential spirit. To keep ourselves in Lent is a great challenge as the rhythms of our souls often match these natural cycles. But this challenge lies at the very heart of our decision to take up the cross and follow.

When all is bright and warm, will we still walk this challenging path of discipleship? When the world (both its natural realities and those human-created ones) sings its siren song to walk a different path, will we remain committed? Stories and poems abound concerning divergent paths and the great difference in life that comes by choosing one over another. If we choose nature's model, then it would be the path of least resistance. This is how rain drops and what rivers follow. If we choose the world's path, then it would be the path of self-centered existence. If we choose Jesus' model, then it would be the path of resistance.
