

Fruit Bowl

This plain white china bowl from England has been in my family for over 4 generations. It carries no significant value and is really nothing special with chips, discoloration, and sign of wear. I can't recall seeing it on my grandparent's table when I was young, but have been told it was always a present reality. Now it sits in the center of our table with the sixth generation of a family looking to its contents for nourishment and health.



This is not unlike our faith, which is often passed to us, if not directly from generations prior, then by our representing the current chapter of the history of God's people. The bowl has been given to our care. There are signs of the long life of this faith, the many hands which have taken from this sustenance and nourishment. This past has had plenty of challenges, chips in it by what those waving the banner of faith have done or not done, said or not said in the name of Christ. Yet it remains intact, only affected by our own care or neglect. Many view it as nothing special or of value, leaving a question of why we would seek to have or pass it on at all, particularly given all the chips and wear.

So ... will this be a continued presence on the tables of our lives? Will people of faith fill this bowl and be nourished from it by the fruits of the Spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, fruitfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal. 5:22-23)? Because more than the cracks, chips or discoloration of the past from our neglect and failures, it shows the persistence of God's abiding presence in Jesus Christ. That remains intact.

Food & Supplies Needed for Local Families
