HERE'S A WAY TO ENHANCE YOUR BIBLE READING; Try keeping a Journal. Sometimes when you are reading something in the reading will speak to you or stand out to you. Take a moment and write it down the SCRIPTURE. Then make an OBSERVATION (what spoke to me??). Thirdly, ask "How would I APPLY this to my life. Finally, make what you learned into a PRAYER. This method of bible reading is called the S.O.A.P. method and allows us to ask "how will I be different because of what I just read?"

Parting Thought

I have come to see that the Bible is not a record of fully qualified people following God's call on their lives. Instead, what I see is that the Bible records stories of broken and imperfect human beings who hear the call of God on their lives and live out that call as best they can. All too often we look at Moses and David and Paul and other biblical "heroes" as if there was something inherently special in them. I think the same applies to our modern heroes as well. The current movie "Selma" is a telling of the life of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and his role in the civil rights movement. The movie portrays Dr. King as a human being choosing to respond faithfully to the needs and injustices of his time. It makes him appear very human. That is a good thing. Someone once said that God does not call the qualified - we are all flawed, broken and human. However, God does qualify the called. That is to say God gives us the grace and strength to do what God has called us to do. When we think about what God is calling us to be a part of and when we consider the difficulty of being faithful to that call, we should fall to our knees and trust ourselves to God's strength and grace and mercy. Having surrendered to God we get off of our knees and proceed to do the very best we can while allowing God to work through us. We ought to work as if it all depends on us while believing that only God can make it happen.
