Hi Everyone:

In preparing my current series of sermons on the "fruit of the spirit" I have been struck with the power and impact of choice. It is the critical component of all of life's transformation and change. What will I choose. Being a disciple of John Wesley I believe we are endowed by God with the power to choose. I am never forced to follow Jesus, I am never forced to done one thing or another. God invites me (granted God can be very persuasive) and I choose. Will I choose to grow deeper in my relationship with God? Will I choose to live the way Christ has showed me? Or will I choose any one of an infinite number of alternatives. What will I choose? Part of the struggle of breaking routines and moving in new directions is that the current routine and the current direction are the direct consequence of choice I made. I often find myself lamenting particularly busy stretches in my schedule until I realize that most of the busyness is the direct result

of choices I have made. In our discussion on the fruit of the spirit the heart of the matter is what will I choose? Will I choose to abide and grow in my relationship with God through Jesus Christ or will I just continue to do what I've always done and gradually flow in the direction I am going. Going with the flow makes sense unless you've ever been in a canoe in fast water. If I just flow at the pace of the water I have no control and am at the mercy of the river. In order to steer clear of the rocks and other dangers I have to make the choice (and the effort) to go faster (or slower) than the flow. Then I can steer the canoe and have a better chance of going where I am trying to go. What about your spiritual life? Do you need to speed up? Or slow down? Do you need to pull out of the river all together for a time or a season? What do we need to do to abide and stay connected to Christ?
