A Word From Ed Fisher - Staff- Parish Relations Team

Based on the pledged income and anticipated income from other sources the 2016 budget was adjusted by the Church Council in February.

The staff salaries were adjusted with the result that:

Pastor Darryl Barrow's appointment at Christ Church could no longer be sustained financially

During meetings with the District Superintendent, Rev Wayne Butler, it was decided that what we needed and could afford was an Interim Pastor who could assess the situation at CUMC and begin the revitalization process while operating at less than full time. The search was initiated by the DS to make this appointment. On June 16 we learned that the Bishop appointed the Rev. James (Jim) Pollard to be our Interim Senior Pastor for one year.
