Hi Everyone:

Near record setting heat must mean it is Vacation Bible School week at Christ Church. We are having an "Everywhere Fun Fair" with over 40 children and a host of story tellers, game teachers, crafts directors, music leaders and guides. Sally Pollard and her team are doing a great job and the kids seem to be having a great time (in spite of the heat!). This year's VBS has been done in conjunction with our neighbors at the Amherst Community Church and we will have a joint "Everywhere Fun Fair" here at Christ church this Saturday morning from 10:00 to Noon. Come and join the fun! VBS, using the same decorations and materials, will be a the Amherst Community Church next week. The children are learning about neighbors around the world (Japan, Zimbabwe, The United Kingdom, Australia and Mexico) and how God calls us to live with our neighbors near and far.

- 4. **Refugee family arrives early Wednesday night.** The family will arrive in the U.S. on Tuesday, July 16th, but will not arrive in Buffalo until 11:50 pm on Wednesday, July 17th. **Join us at the airport at 11:50 to welcome the Keh Blut family to their new home**

Here is what we know about the family so far:

Keh Blut, the father. The family is Karen and coming in from Thailand. There are **two parents 4 daughters** aged 12, 14, 16, and 18 **2 sons** aged 9, and 1 yr old.

Karen people are an ethnic minority in Myanmar (Burma). Many have fled to refugee camps in Thailand to escape violence including killings, torture, land mines, rape, forced labor, and enslavement. Historically the Karen people were the first to embrace Christianity in what was then known as Burma. Many of them are Baptist because the first missionaries to arrive there in the 1880's were Baptists. The Kareni translation of the Bible was done by a Bible Translator who was sponsored by a Baptist Church in Utica, New York.

Thank you to Peggy Bermudez and Lee Watson and their team (and all of you who volunteered many hours to help!!!). I am excited that Christ Church will be the first to welcome these newest Americans!

Parting Thought . . .

I learned a long time ago that what is "legal" is not necessarily "moral" and what is considered "according to the law" does not necessarily fulfill the requirements of justice. I can see that the jury in the Zimmerman case made their decision according to the directions they were given and according to the laws of the state of Florida. I am appalled that what happened in this case could have been allowed under the laws of any civilized state. I am a person of privilege (white, male, university product) and, sometimes, have a difficult time understanding the role of race and poverty and societal constraints in these kinds of legal cases. Having said that, I am pretty certain that had the races been different (had young Mr. Martin been a white teen ager in a hoodie eating skittles and drinking mountain dew) things would have transpired differently. We live in a hurting and broken world. The Bible (Old and New) calls us to seek justice, fairness, mercy, grace, etc. We don't wait to seek these values in the 'afterlife'. We are called to live by these values and seek and work for them every moment of every day. Our call is to build the Kingdom of God on Earth. . . and so I find myself asking myself that same horrendously difficult question: what have I done today to make our world and our society kinder and more just for everyone.
