During one such paddle, I shared historical information with my daughter on the Erie Canal, what a canal is / its purpose, why it is called a barge canal, why it is called the tow path, etc (I'm sure she appreciated the history lesson!). One recent water journey explored the base of the Lockport locks. Contemplating the massive obstacles that were faced in the creation of the Erie Canal, overcoming things like the escarpment, my smallness looking upon these doors ... well, it has me thinking about the state of affairs. In so many moments of history, things looked as intimidating and impenetrable as these doors from the perspective of a canoe or as impossible and impassable as the escarpment likely was during the construction of the canal. However, through inspiration, ingenuity, determination and faith these have been overcome. Whether it is sending a person to the moon, crossing an ocean by boat or plane, or creating a waterway to link the Great Lakes to the Atlantic Ocean,



humankind has proven that when faced with what appears an overwhelming task, it can accomplish amazing feats.

For myself, I always find that the first and foremost of these is what was done for us in Jesus Christ. We bob among the waves of life staring up at the insurmountable, unable to see or

imagine a way forward. Like the doors of the locks or the path they ultimately create up or down the escarpment, what seems impossible and impassable - reconnecting us to God - is overcome through the grace of Christ. Through grace, divine engineering conquers those challenges, opening doors and providing a way forward for us and our world. I feel that if we once again look back upon this great divine engineering miracle and seek the same Spirit-led inspiration, we will discover the means and ability to meet this moment and move toward a future that gets closer and closer to what God has in mind for us and our world.
