## **Day Lilies**

There are a number of flowers which open, close and / or follow the sun as it makes its way across the sky, such as day lilies which we have in a couple of areas bordering fences and garages. They are now in full bloom, opening to the sun in daytime and closing at night, with the flower only lasting a couple of days before falling off in its curled state.

The Gospel of John refers to Jesus as the light. Resurrection itself is often connected with the dawn of a new day of creation drawing upon the similarities of sunrise and the son's



rise. Elsewhere Jesus is called the daystar. As I have admired the lilies this year it has caused me to think about how we open to God's light in Christ as it comes into our lives. Does it cause us to flower, opening that inner beauty of our best selves which God knows and by the grace in Christ opens to the world? I hope we might be as engaging as the lilies of the field, as open to the Son's light as they are to sunlight. With that prayer, let the words of Charles Wesley's hymn ring in our ears:

#### **Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies**

(elsewhere known as the 'Morning Hymn')

Christ, whose glory fills the skies, Christ, the true, the only light, Sun of Righteousness, arise, Triumph o'er the shades of night: Day-spring from on high, be near: Day-star, in my heart appear.

Dark and cheerless is the morn Unaccompanied by thee, Joyless is the day's return, Till thy mercy's beams I see; Till thy inward light impart, Glad my eyes, and warm my heart.

Visit then this soul of mine,
Pierce the gloom of sin, and grief,
Fill me, Radiancy Divine,
Scatter all my unbelief,
More and more thyself display,
Shining to the perfect day.
