

On July 8<sup>th</sup> the Harlem Kensington Cleveland Community Association will hold its Garden View tour of community gardens. The Celebration Garden at Christ Church will be a part of that tour. The Celebration Garden began in the fall of 2002 when Pat and Peter Zaleski transformed a

patch of ground into a garden that would celebrate life; a place to remember and reflect on the joy we find in living and loving. The "seed" of a plan took root. The transformation of hard, dry soil now gives life to dogwoods, plum trees, hostas, azaleas, and cone flowers. But visitors find much more in this garden.

Those whose lives feel dry and lifeless may experience the same "cracking open" of their shell. July 1 marks my first anniversary as your Pastor. It has been an interesting, challenging, and eventful year. Happy Anniversary everyone! At Annual Conference this past week nearly every one of my colleagues, after the usually formal greetings, asked the same question: "So, how is it going at Christ church?" This seemingly innocuous question sent me pondering and wondering, so, how is it going? Here is my response:

I was asked to come here because Christ Church was in need of revitalization. The five months prior to my arrival my mind was preoccupied with

two things: 1) saying goodbye to my church community in Syracuse; and, 2) pondering how does one arrive in a new place, get established, and begin to lead in a new direction? Revitalization was the focus of my 2007 Doctoral dissertation; it is something I have experienced, something I have studied and something I care passionately about. I want to help build strong vital churches. After several meetings with Pastor Theva, the SPRC, and the Church Council of Christ Church last spring, we worked out a plan of entry that could lay the foundation for our future work together.

The plan was simple. I would invest the first 100 days getting to know the Christ Church family and our community. I met with all the identified leaders of the church, one on one, to learn of their families, their ministries, their hopes, and dreams. Next I met with the overwhelming majority of the active congregation in small groups in people's homes. We would have beverage and dessert and I would hear of your Christ Church stories and you would get to know me a little better. I also decided to preach a series of sermons on being on a journey – experiences on the road. All of this was intended to help us get to know each other and to help get the "big picture" of where we are.

I have learned over the years that leadership is earned not conferred. There are certain rights that are extended to a person because he/she has the title: Pastor. But that is the lowest level of leadership possible. Leadership is built through relationships and positive experiences together. In light of this understanding I was looking for some opportunities to help us in tangible ways and was blessed to find the Boiler project sitting there for us to engage together. Success on that project helped us learn some things about each other and moved us deeper in our relationship together.

So, how are we doing? Worship attendance is running about 20% ahead of a year ago. We have seen growth in our outreach, our mission, and our participation on many levels. I have been privileged to preside at the funerals of some great Christ Church people. I have been blessed to perform baptisms and a wedding. I have watched the energy in our community grow on an almost weekly basis. I am excited to preach at Christ Church and excited to see what's already happened.

We have a great staff (Sally, Rachel, Elizabeth, Dave, and Doris). We have a great leadership team and ready and willing ministry team leaders. We have a terrific commitment to be in mission in Buffalo and around the world. We have worked hard to reconnect with the community and the world around us here in Snyder. The reality is this: great people make a great difference in building a great church. Christ Church has great people.

And, what is next? We have set a goal to have 500 in worship and 100 in Sunday school by 2015 (1 and 5 by 15). We have set a goal of getting every member and friend of Christ Church engaged in some form of hands on mission on a regular basis. Later this summer we will be working to build up our ministry with children and their families. We are exploring ways to improve our parking situation. We are exploring opportunities to help all of us go deeper in our faith and our relationship with God through Jesus Christ. We are working to deepen our community connections. We are looking to deepen our relationships within the Christ Church family. Many new ideas and possibilities will be offered as we move into our second year together.

How are we doing? I think we are doing great! And we are getting better.


