# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### Solid & Sound

For over 18 years this canoe has provided us with countless memories. A few years back, its original wood gunwales, which provide both structural rigidity and hold the seats in, started suffering from dry rot. It has sat neglected for 2 years, unable to be used, awaiting either decommission or repair and redemption. I tracked down some replacement aluminum gunwales, familiarized myself with the process, and undertook the repair on Sunday afternoon to add to potential family fun this summer. Step-by-step, rivet-by-rivet, one side

and then the other, and finally the seats and yoke and it was as good as new! It is solid and seaworthy.

Aren't we blessed that God doesn't look at the status of our lives and world and declare that repair and redemption is impossible?! Rather, in Christ we have one who provides us a step-by-step path to salvation and peace and the same possibility for our world. But we can come to see our faith as something that *once* influenced our lives. While in some fashion it remains, it becomes a symbol of the past that at one time held the hopes for the future. The structure it gave crumbling over time due to neglect.

If we listen to Christ and follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we can, through a few steps, bring our faith back to the strength it once had and the hope it

provides. Daily prayer, reading Scripture, spiritual friendships, giving, service, and worship are each like a rivet helping to reattach faith back to our lives. If we are willing to start ... for example with a prayer at a meal, then add one before bed, and then another when we begin our day, our lives will slowly be reshaped by the structure of faith. One-by-one, a little at a time, we will find that our faith is renewed, solid and sure, providing us the confidence to face the present and the future unafraid.
