When the oppression of others makes it impossible for you to enjoy your own freedom, when you don't enjoy your own food knowing that there are others who have little or no food or clean water to eat & drink and when you can feel something happening inside you that feels like God's Spirit calling you to action, well, you just have to respond with faith and love. And you will never be the same.

Jessica is now off to her summer work at Camp Asbury. Courtney Catudella, a student at SUNY Geneseo, has just returned from study in Costa Rica and joins Jessica at Camp Asbury as a summer camp staff person.
