Last Sunday I shared with those in worship some of Rev. Barrow's thoughts in a letter to the churches of the Crossroads District where he has served as District Superintendant. He was prompted to write these thoughts following the shooting at Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC. He posed these questions...

"How do people of color continue to find love in the midst of this kind of hate; grace and forgiveness in the midst of this kind of adversity; and love for our enemies?"

"When will this end, friends? When will more of the people who represent the dominant culture, and more of my white sisters and brothers in our UM Church simply say and profoundly mean it, that enough is enough, even at the risk of being called names? Even at the risk of bearing the cross of Christ more faithfully?"

"As I am preparing to be pastor at a church, I pray they will be ready to come alongside with me (DRB) and be a true partner about this matterand other matters that have historically done so much harm to others...We are all part of the problem, we can all part of the solution."

I invite you to continue your reflecting and to share the thoughts in your hearts and minds. Together we can do more to shape the world as God envisions.
