Hi Everyone:

I have just returned from Annual Conference and feel like a fresh wind of the Spirit has blown through Upper New York. Annual Conference is the regional body of the United Methodist Church and, as an Elder, is my church. When the Upper New York Annual Conference gathers is the gathering of my church. I have made a study of leadership for the past 25 years – a good 20% of my library books are on leadership and how to be a better leader, I have attended The Leadership Summit (put on by Willow Creek) at least a dozen times. It was a great blessing to see good leadership at work at Annual Conference through our new bishop, Mark J. Webb. Leadership is about creating a culture where the vision can be lived out. On the Annual Conference level this requires a change in temperature, a change in focus and a significant change in functioning. We have to begin to adjust how we live out our lives of faith together. Bishop Webb brought a wind of grace and hope to the proceedings. 1) Our "change a life" program continues. Donation jars are located at the back of the sanctuary, in the cafe and in the office. You can help change the life for victims of domestic violence by donating your spare change.

Parting Thought

I've been thinking about Julie and Hannah and the Confirmation of their faith. The word Confirmation assumes that some faith has been "pre-planted". Someone believed for these young women and brought them to the church for baptism. Someone loved these young women and brought them to worship and Sunday school and other events related to the church community. Faith has existed in and around them since the day they were born. Confirmation is that vital moment on the journey when they publicly claim that faith – the faith others previously claimed for them – for themselves. This is a basic Christian understanding. At some moment on the journey all of us have to make a choice as to whether to be a Christ follower or not. All who call themselves Christian have staked this claim; have made this choice. All of us who call themselves Christian have made both a private and public profession of faith. We chose within ourselves to respond to God's gracious love and we chose to make it known that we are now identified as one of Christ's own. I invite you to join me in daily prayer between now and Sunday. Pray for Julie and Hannah. Pray that the Holy Spirit will confirm their choice by filling them both with grace and empowering them to be faithful followers of Jesus. Confirmation, like Graduation and marriage and so many of the other pivotal life moments does not mark the end of a journey but its new beginning. What was once believed on our behalf by our parents and sponsors is now our faith, our belief, our newly expressed trust in God.
