Weekly Update: June 7, 2016

A Word From Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday was my last "First Sunday" here at Christ Church before beginning my new pastoral appointment at Lockport: Emmanuel UMC. The theme of last Sunday's message was "Do Not Weep." In Luke's Gospel chapter 7:11-17 Jesus saw a widowed, desolate mother, had compassion for her, thinking perhaps of his own mother reputedly widowed at an early age. "Do not weep," he told her. Her tears for her son no doubt now intermingling with the endless salty tears shed for her husband; and in the continuing drama risking ceremonial impurity, he reached out, touched the bier and possibly the body, and the procession halted...why? Two processions - one going into Nain and headed up by Jesus, the Lord of Life; the other going out of Nain and headed up by death. Jesus showed his deep compassion for the widow's suffering. Jesus always had compassion for people. We see it time and time again in Scripture. He healed people, fed them, he embraced them and was concerned for people's well-being. The role of the Church is similar. We are to show compassion on people and to help ease their suffering as best we can. The Church is to be the voice of those who have no voice in society; we are to be the hands and feet of Christ in the community and in the world, not looking for anything in return. "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden," said Jesus. The Church is to be the beacon, a light that shines in this darkened world to lead people to safety, to bring them home, and into the loving arms of God. This is our mission. This is the Gospel in a nutshell; Jesus was raised from the dead, not so he would have life but that we would have life. The earthly ministry of Jesus is meant to be a model for us on how we are to live our lives. Jesus never did anything for himself, he sacrificed himself for others, he provided for others before he even provided for himself, and this is what we are called to do not only as individuals but as the church. We are church when our attention turns outside these walls to the community that exists, not within the church alone, but outside the church. Yes, we need to care for each other, but that comes after we care for others. This is the essence of the Gospel. This is the life of a Christian, and this is the purpose of the Church. Just as Jesus brought hope to the widow who had lost her son, we need to bring hope into the world that has lost hope. Just as Jesus told the woman not to weep, we need to help the world, one person at a time, and bring them hope so they will not weep. Do not weep because the God that created you loves you and cares for you and wants you to know God's love, Christ Church! This Gospel story is a story of unconditional grace, and hope and love – it is no mistake that Christ Church has as our mission statement – "living Christ's ways and exploding in love and service!" As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship this Sunday!
