Seasonal Shifts

I've always found Lent a little hard to maintain in the sense of its dark, introspective, contemplative reality. Advent, the other penitential season, seems easier if only because it is a time of decreasing natural light and temperature vs. Lent with its increasing daylight hours, warmth, and sun. Remaining steadfast in our seasonal disciplines is not challenging or even the progression of the season toward the cross, but this battle against our natural surroundings.

I'm certainly not advocating for an extension of winter, but perhaps this very tension is a key facet in understanding the challenge of the cross. To walk the path of discipleship, to bear the cross and follow is not easy. Changes in the weather are far from the greatest challenges we will face in following Jesus. Perhaps, though, this tension within this season is a small way that we experience that greater tension of a life of discipleship through the inclination to revel in this weather, self-indulgent as it is or the move to lay aside what we should be doing in place of what we want to do simply because the mercury achieves a particular mark.

Yet our natural world also provides the first hints of the glory of the resurrection for us as it awakens from its cold tomb of winter. It encourages us to recognize that the dark grip of death is not the last word, but the warmth of Son-light will prevail! May this help fuel our standing and remaining in this season. May it provide the encouragement to continue our disciplines and focus on the cross. And may it give us the courage and the hope to face the future unafraid. -Pastor Daven

Please be advised of new guidelines for those wishing to worship together in person at Christ Church:

-All will be required to wear a mask. We will have a limited supply of masks on hand for those who come without one.

-Enter through one door at the main entrance.

-Use hand sanitizer at the provided station before entering the Sanctuary.

-Maintain social distancing (6 feet apart) from those not within your immediate family.

-Please do not enter the building if you are experiencing any symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, chills, diarrhea).


Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week By: <u>Amy-Jill Levine</u>

UMCOR Hygiene Kits

The Outreach Team invites you to assemble a Hygiene Kit for UMCOR! These kits will help people who have suffered due to natural disasters. The supplies can be assembled and placed in a large plastic gallon bag and then brought to church. We will collect them until UMCOR Sunday on **March 14**, **2021**.

Hygiene Kit Materials

- One hand towel $(15 \times 25 17 \times 27 \text{ inches})$
- No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- **One washcloth**
 - No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One comb
 - Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
 - No pocket combs or picks
 - Rattail/ combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- · One toenail or fingernail clipper
- No emery boards or metal nail files
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)
 - No Ivory or Jergen's soap
 - Do not remove from packaging

· One adult toothbrush

- Do not remove from packaging
- Personal advertising not acceptable
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
 - Common household bandages acceptable
- One one-gallon size re-sealable bag
- Hygiene Kit Value: \$12.00 per kit

Assembly Instructions

- 1. Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- 2. Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- 3. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- 4. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- 5. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- 6. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.
