Hi Everyone:

I'm one week into Lent and I'm trying to make space to sit with God; how are you doing? Over the years of my Christian journey, I have found that the hardest part of having communication with God is turning off the static around me and inside of me. I sit to pray and my mind goes bouncing around from distraction to distraction; from bright shiny object to bright shiny object; from to do lists to anger fantasies to whatever might take me away from being quiet and listening to the voice of God. Because I am an extrovert I have to impose order from the outside. I keep a prayer journal where I can write down the distractions – when there are no more things popping into my head I can begin to pray. Some days this takes longer than others. Sometimes I use an old Quaker centering technique – sit quietly with feet flat on the floor and palms down on my thighs. I listen to my breathing and as thoughts and issues pop into my mind I offer them to God. When the flow of distractions stops I flip my hands over and see myself receiving from God the

answers to all of those distractions, problems, needs, etc. Now I am ready to listen. I am ready to begin to pray. Remember, when you sit to listen to God, turn off the phone and other electronics – it can wait – and just be.

Here is what is happening at church:

- 1. Attendance last Sunday was in the 130's I didn't see anyone come in for the 10:00 or the Noon worship gathering on time change weekend. There were over 40 of us for the Ash Wednesday gathering on March 5.
- 2. This Sunday is the 2nd Sunday of Lent. I will be preaching from John 3:1-17. It is primarily the story of a very religious man named Nicodemus. Nicodemus has been faithfully following the dictates of his religion but is yearning for something more. He comes to Jesus under the cover of night and experiences something greater. C.S. Lewis wrote: "if I discover in myself a desire for which nothing in this world can satisfy the only logical conclusion is that I was created for another world." Nicodemus comes to Jesus to fulfill that deepest of desires.
- 3. The "Discussion/Action" group met again last night. We discussed Small Group ministries, especially as it related to Seniors and Singles. Some action plans are being developed. We also discussed the ministry of hospitality and how we can be more welcoming when there are guests in our midst. We discussed the process of congregational revitalization: there is an inward transformation as people move to a deeper relationship with Christ and one another and there is an outward focus as we seek to make a difference in the world for Jesus sake. We can't have one without the other. Both working in tandem reenergizes and transforms a Christian community. We appreciate your prayers. The next gathering will be on April 28 (Monday) at 7:00.

Parting Thought:

The reality is that there is not much else I can do. Mark Twain once quipped that "everyone complains about the weather but nobody does anything about it." No panic here. We'll just hunker down, read a book, watch some movies wait for the storm to pass and then we'll put on the boots and woolies and dig ourselves out once again. Rather than be defeated by these life experiences ought we not simply hunker down under the shelter of God's wings, ride out the storm, and, then, pick ourselves up again and begin to trudge forward once more? It is usually not the storms that beat us but our attitude. One of my mentors used to say that he was either up or getting up. Another of my teachers spoke frequently about being knocked down seven times and getting up eight. Early on this journey I would wonder what they meant. I understand it better now and I realize that the storms of life can wreak havoc all around us and will, on occasion, drag us down. I could stay down if I so choose. Or I can take the "snowpocalypse" attitude – ride it out, dig on out, and push forward (once more into the breach we go?) when it passes. I am building for a better future. How is it with you?
