Wanted: Gently-Used Long-Sleeved Shirts

WHY LONG-SLEEVE SHIRTS? Our nation's 2.5 million farmworkers face long hours of arduous work putting their health and safety at risk due to exposure to dangerous pesticides and heat stress. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency indicates that over 20,000 cases of doctor-diagnosed pesticide poisoning are reported yearly. A gently used long-sleeve shirt can help prevent exposure to pesticides by covering the skin, which is the most common route of pesticide poisoning due to its exposure.

Shirts collected during this annual drive will be distributed to farmworkers in New York State and New England to help protect them from the hazards of pesticide exposure and heat stress through PathStone, a multi-state organization serving farmworkers and the poor through ministries of outreach and housing,

Bring shirts to the church by March 25, 2018 and leave them in the collection area in Crafts Hall.
