Truing Wheels

I have just enough knowledge on bicycle maintenance to get me in trouble. One aspect of care and upkeep is truing of the wheel. This is a process whereby any fluctuations in a wheel's balance caused by rough pavement and general riding is corrected by tightening or loosening various spokes with a spoke wrench. One uses a special stand to guide the process, a truing stand. It takes patience and practice.




Sunday, March 31 at Noon
