Many of us have made similar donations in the past to the church, to Asbury Shalom Zone (when



it was still around), to Goodwill, and to any number of other charities. When we clean out and give away things that no longer have utility in our lives, we tend to feel so altruistic. Many of these things do, indeed, go to help and provide so much to so many. Honestly, however, surveying much of it shows it to simply be our leftovers — the stale / hardened remnants of things long past their usefulness and not fit for anyone or anything.

Biblically we are asked to give our best to God first. Like the tables Jesus turned at the temple, it seeks to flip the equation of putting ourselves first to putting others first. Whether its the "first fruits" referred to in the Old Testament (Neh. 10:35, Lev. 23:10-14, Ex. 23:19, Num. 18:12) or the lessons that Jesus teaches like that just of this past week at the Last Supper from Lk. 22:26, "the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves," we are asked to give our best, not our leftovers. What would it look like in both our donations and our giving to truly do this? What would it look like to give our best - the best of our time, talents, and

treasure? What difference and impact would that make in the lives of others and in the world?

While Dumpster Dave and his companions are happy for the easy meal, it is a strong encouragement to think both about our waste and about the formula of our giving. As we come into this holiest of times, let us truly consider and live as Christ did, giving the best of ourselves. It is when we serve as Christ, that we both receive and extend the very grace of God.



UMCOR Hygiene Kits

The Outreach Team invites you to assemble a Hygiene Kit for UMCOR! These kits will help people who have suffered due to natural disasters. The supplies can be assembled and placed in a large plastic gallon bag and then brought to church. We will collect them until **Sunday**, **March 28**, **2021**.

Hygiene Kit Materials

- **One hand towel** (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)
 - No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- · One washcloth
 - No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- · One comb
 - Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
 - No pocket combs or picks
 - Rattail/ combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
 - No emery boards or metal nail files
- · Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)
 - No Ivory or Jergen's soap
 - Do not remove from packaging
- · One adult toothbrush
 - Do not remove from packaging

- Personal advertising not acceptable
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
 - Common household bandages acceptable
- · One one-gallon size re-sealable bag

Hygiene Kit Value: \$12.00 per kit

Assembly Instructions

- 1. Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- 2. Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- 3. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- 4. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- 5. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- 6. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.
